Scripture References from the Sermon

Explicitly Referenced

****2 Chronicles 20:1-30**** — The primary text of the sermon, covering Jehoshaphat and the vast army from Moab, Ammon, and Mount Seir

****2 Chronicles 20:3**** — Jehoshaphat, alarmed, resolved to inquire of the Lord and proclaimed a fast

****2 Chronicles 20:6**** — Jehoshaphat's prayer: God rules over all kingdoms; power and might are in His hand

****2 Chronicles 20:9**** — God's promise regarding crying out in distress before the temple

****2 Chronicles 20:12**** — "We do not know what to do, but our eyes are upon you"

****2 Chronicles 20:15**** — "The battle is not yours, but God's"

****2 Chronicles 20:17**** — "You will not have to fight this battle... stand firm and see the deliverance the Lord will give you"

****2 Chronicles 20:21**** — Singers appointed to lead the

army praising God

****2 Chronicles 20:22-24**** — God sends ambushes; the enemies destroy one another; dead bodies found

****2 Chronicles 20:25-30**** — Plunder collected over three days; Valley of Beracah; peace granted

Referenced by Theme or Allusion

****Psalm 23**** — Pastor alludes to "restore my soul, O Lord"

****Psalm 103:10**** — God does not treat us as our sins deserve; pastor references David's sentiment directly

****Isaiah 55:8-9**** — God's ways and thoughts are higher and beyond human understanding

****Romans 13:1**** — No authority exists except what God has established

****Proverbs 3:34 / James 4:10 / 1 Peter 5:6**** — Humble yourself before God and He will lift you up; referenced from a Monday night group discussion

****Philippians 4:13**** — "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength"

****Matthew 10:32-33**** — Jesus declaring before the Father those who declare Him before men

****Luke 17:15-16**** — The one leper who returned and fell with his face to the ground to give thanks

****Matthew 18:19-20**** — "If two or more agree," referenced critically in the context of formulaic prayer

****1 Samuel 15:22**** — God desires obedience rather than sacrifice

****Genesis 3**** — Eve looking at the forbidden fruit and finding it increasingly appealing; the danger of keeping eyes on temptation

****Psalm 22:3**** — God inhabits the praises of His people, referenced in the context of worship before battle

****Acts 17:26**** — God determined the appointed times and places for people; referenced in the pastoral prayer regarding Joel Rogers

****Psalm 139:16**** — All days were ordained before one of them came to be; referenced in the pastoral prayer
