The message reminds us that we're living stones in God's kingdom, priests who represent God to others and others to God. We're not independent operators but interdependent members of His body, designed to hold each other in place like those ancient stacked stone fences that have stood for centuries. The call is clear: finish strong, stay humble, and let God's Word become so familiar to us that it shapes every decision we make.
