The man with the shriveled hand obeyed Jesus immediately despite the embarrassment of being singled out in public — what fears or insecurities in your own life might be preventing you from responding to what God is calling you to do?

The sermon draws a striking contrast between demons who immediately recognized and submitted to Jesus and believers who often ignore or delay obeying him — what does this reveal about the condition of your own heart toward God's authority?

Jesus felt deep anger and distress at the stubborn hearts of the religious leaders in Mark 3, not because they broke a rule but because they refused to choose good — in what areas of your life might your own stubbornness be grieving God in a similar way?

The passage in Matthew 12 warns that a person who is spiritually cleansed but left empty is vulnerable to something worse returning — what does it mean practically for a believer to be filled rather than simply emptied of sin?

The sermon suggests that many Christians seek change without truly surrendering their will, wanting the benefits of transformation without the cost of obedience — how honestly can you say that your faith involves a genuine surrender of your will to God?

Jesus slept peacefully through a violent storm while his disciples panicked and questioned whether he cared about them — what does your default response to crisis reveal about how deeply you trust God's presence and sovereignty in your life?

The sermon connects a lack of joy in believers to a lack of peace, and a lack of peace to shaky faith — how would you honestly assess the level of genuine joy and peace in your own walk with Christ, and what might that indicate about your faith?

The preacher describes the tendency to pray and give a burden to God, then take it back, like pulling something out of the trash — what specific burdens or fears do you repeatedly reclaim from God, and what would it look like to truly release them?

The sermon argues that many things we label as psychological or behavioral struggles may have a spiritual or demonic dimension — how does your worldview shape the way you seek help and healing, and are there areas where you may be overlooking the spiritual reality?

A divided kingdom cannot stand, and the sermon applies this principle to the internal tug of war between surrendering to God and clinging to self-will — what would it look like for you to stop being divided and fully align yourself with God's purposes for your life?
