

# Scripture References from the Sermon

## Explicitly Cited or Directly Referenced

**\*\*Mark 3:1-6\*\*** — The man with the shriveled hand in the synagogue; the Pharisees watching Jesus to accuse him; Jesus healing on the Sabbath; the Pharisees plotting with the Herodians to kill Jesus

**\*\*Mark 3:11\*\*** — Evil spirits falling down before Jesus and declaring him the Son of God

**\*\*Mark 3:20-30\*\*** — The crowd gathering so Jesus and disciples could not eat; his family saying he was out of his mind; teachers of the law accusing him of being possessed by Beelzebub; the divided kingdom/house teaching; the unforgivable sin of blaspheming the Holy Spirit

**\*\*Mark 4:35-41\*\*** — Jesus calming the storm; the disciples asking if he cared whether they drowned

**\*\*Matthew 12:43-45\*\*** — The unclean spirit returning to the swept and empty house with seven more wicked spirits

**\*\*James 2:19\*\*** — Even the demons believe and shudder

**\*\*Ephesians 6\*\*** — The rank and file of demonic forces (referenced generally by the speaker)

**\*\*Philippians 4:6-7\*\*** — Presenting petitions to God and receiving the peace that transcends all understanding, guarding hearts and minds

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## Alluded to Without Direct Citation

**\*\*Genesis 1:1-3\*\*** — The earth being formless and void; God speaking light into existence

**\*\*Genesis 1:26\*\*** — "Let us make man in our image"

**\*\*Genesis 6:5\*\*** — Every inclination of the human heart being evil continually

**\*\*Acts 17:26\*\*** — God determining the appointed times and exact places where people should live (referenced in the opening prayer)

**\*\*Galatians 5:22-23\*\*** — The fruit of the Spirit, specifically peace and joy

**\*\*Hebrews 6:19\*\*** — Jesus as the anchor of the soul (central metaphor of the sermon series)
