This Week's Passage:

Deuteronomy 6:1-25 (NIV)

1 These are the commands, decrees and laws the LORD your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess, 2 so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the LORD your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life. 3 Hear, Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the LORD, the God of your ancestors, promised you. 4 Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. 5 Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. 6 These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 8 Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 9 Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.

This Week's Passage Cont.

Deuteronomy 6:1-25 (NIV)

10 When the LORD your God brings you into the land he swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you--a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build, 11 houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves you did not plant--then when you eat and are satisfied, 12 be careful that you do not forget the LORD, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. 13 Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name. 14 Do not follow other gods, the gods of the peoples around you; 15 for the LORD your God, who is among you, is a jealous God and his anger will burn against you, and he will destroy you from the face of the land. 16 Do not put the LORD your God to the test as you did at Massah. 17 Be sure to keep the commands of the LORD your God and the stipulations and decrees he has given you. 18 Do what is right and good in the LORD's sight, so that it may go well with you and you may go in and take over the good land the LORD promised on oath to your ancestors, 19 thrusting out all your enemies before you, as the LORD said. 20 In the future, when your son asks you, "What is the meaning of the stipulations, decrees and laws the LORD our God has commanded you?" 21 tell him: "We were slaves of Pharaoh in Egypt, but the LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand. 22 Before our eyes the LORD sent signs and wonders--great and terrible--on Egypt and Pharaoh and his whole household. 23 But he brought us out from there to bring us in and give us the land he promised on oath to our ancestors. 24 The LORD commanded us to obey all these decrees and to fear the LORD our God, so that we might always prosper and be kept alive, as is the case today. 25 And if we are careful to obey all this law before the LORD our God, as he has commanded us, that will be our righteousness."

Connection Question:

Why do you think God emphasizes remembering His commands and passing them on to future generations?

TRUTH #1:

Loving God Fully is the Foundation of Obedience

Discussion Points:

1. God calls His people to love Him with heart, soul, and strength (Deut. 6:5; Matt. 22:37).
2. God desires His commandments to be written on our hearts (Deut. 6:6; Psalm 119:11).
3. God's oneness shapes our exclusive devotion to Him (Deut. 6:4; Isaiah 45:5).

Growth Question:

How can we write God's commands on our hearts today?

TRUTH #2:

Remembering God's Faithfulness Guards Us Against Forgetfulness

Discussion Points:

1. Prosperity can cause spiritual amnesia (Deut. 6:11-12; Deut. 8:10-14).
2. God alone delivered Israel from slavery (Deut. 6:12; Ex. 20:2).
3. Followers of God must resist idol worship (Deut. 6:14; 1 John 5:21).

Growth Question:

How has remembering God's past faithfulness helped you trust Him today?

TRUTH #3:

Passing the Faith to the Next Generation is a Divine Assignment

Discussion Points:

1. Parents are responsible to explain the meaning behind God's commands (Deut. 6:20).
2. Obeying God leads to life and blessing (Deut. 6:24).
3. Righteousness is linked to faithful obedience (Deut. 6:25; James 2:17-18).

Growth Question:

How can your home or lifestyle better reflect a commitment to discipling the next generation?

What is one step you can take this week to more fully love, remember, and pass on the ways of the Lord?
