

Kids Camp In 2026-Frequently Asked Questions

What is Kids Camp In?

Kids Camp In is a three-day, two-night camp experience hosted at Spring Hills Church for children who **finished 3rd–6th grade**. Campers enjoy worship, Bible teaching, small groups, games, team competitions, missions, and lots of fun while growing in their relationship with Jesus.

When is Kids Camp In? July 14–16, 2026 (Tuesday–Thursday)

Who can attend? Children who have **finished 3rd-6th grade**.

What is the theme this year?

Equipped -Campers will learn about the **Armor of God** from Ephesians 6 and discover how God equips us to stand strong in our faith every day.

Is this an overnight camp?

Yes! Campers stay overnight at Spring Hills Church for two nights under the supervision of trained adult leaders and volunteers who have passed background checks and approved as volunteers at Spring Hills along with Dan and Brittany Pound

Where do campers sleep?

Campers sleep in designated classrooms with their small groups and adult leaders. Boys and girls sleep in separate areas with appropriate adult supervision. Boys sleep Upstairs, Girls Sleep downstairs with individual tents and air mattresses.

Is the church secure overnight?

Yes. Safety is one of our highest priorities. We have:

- Adult chaperones assigned to each group
- Background-checked volunteers
- Designated security procedures
- Controlled building access
- Security Cameras and Lock-down doors

What activities will campers participate in?

Activities may include:

- Worship services
- Bible classes
- Small group discussions
- Team competitions
- Outdoor games (slip n slide, bubble truck, Lake Hudson etc)
- Missionary presentations
- Crafts and creative activities

- Camp-wide challenges
- Evening events and special surprises

Will my child have a small group leader?

Yes! Every camper is assigned to a small group with consistent leaders who help guide discussions, encourage participation, and build relationships throughout camp.

What meals are provided?

All meals are catered, additional snacks, and drinks during camp are provided

Can accommodation be made for food allergies?

Yes. Please list any allergies or dietary concerns during registration so we can work with your family to provide safe options.

What should my child bring? (See the Packing List)

What should my child NOT bring?

Please leave at home:

- Expensive items like electronics and clothing.
- Video game systems
- Phones
- Energy drinks
- Anything that could distract from the camp experience

Can my child bring a cell phone?

No, campers are requested to leave phones at home. Our goal is for kids to engage fully with camp activities, friendships, and spiritual growth.

What if my child needs medication?

Parents will check medications in during Check-In. Our designated team will administer medications according to the instructions provided.

What if my child gets homesick?

Our leaders are experienced in helping campers adjust. We encourage children to stay and participate, and we will communicate with parents if concerns arise.

Can friends attend together?

Absolutely! Camp is a great opportunity to invite friends. Friends are welcome to register and attend, even if they do not regularly attend Spring Hills Church.

How much does camp cost?

\$125

Will my kids swim?

Maybe we sometimes visit Lake Hudson in Granville, any student who wants to use a diving board or use the deeper part of the Lake has to pass a swim test with life-guards. Many kids choose to use the shallow parts of the lake to play and skip the swim test.

Life guards and chaperones are keeping an eye on campers. Parents can join our driving team for the afternoon and attend or pay to enter and enjoy the visit to Lake Hudson if you are concerned about swimming.

How can I volunteer?

We need adults and students to serve in a variety of roles including:

- Chaperones/ Small Group Leaders
- Activity Leaders
- Kitchen Team
- Camp Nurse
- Set-Up and Tear-Down Teams
