READ - James Chapter 2

1. Why is application of God's Word to our life (being doers of the Word) so essential?

2. What do you do when you find yourself resistant or reluctant in doing what the Word of God instructs you to do?

3. Briefly state the key point of each of these verses:

- c. James 2:8-13

4. How does the Word of God evaluate the behavior of the believers towards the rich man and the poor man? James 2:4

5. In what way are the "poor" of James 2:5 wealthy?

6. James is discussing two types of faith in verses 14-20: professing faith and genuine faith. What does the man of verse 14 say he has?

- a. This man professes (declares) to have faith. State what he does not have.
 - (1.) Works in the Biblical context is defined as acts or deeds. List some synonyms for works.
- b. James 2:14 asks the question: What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith, but does not have works? Can faith save him? How would you answer this question?

(1.) Just professing to be a Christian isn't enough to produce salvation. What did James say must accompany our profession of faith to prove we have faith that saves? Matthew 7:21

7. Paul in Ephesians 2:8-9 clearly states that salvation is not obtained through works. James clearly states that works will accompany salvation. These 2 writers do not contradict one another but their writings complement each other. Paul identified the **root** of genuine faith – belief in Jesus Christ; James identified the **fruit** of genuine faith – love and works. What did Paul say in Ephesians 2:8-10 about works and the believer?
