



MONDAY — PRAY YOUR KINGDOM COME: Matthew 6:9–10

Reflection: Jesus taught His disciples to begin prayer with God's name, God's Kingdom, and God's will. Kingdom prayer shifts our attention from “*Lord, what can You do for me?*” to “*Lord, what do You desire to do through me?*” When we pray, “**Your Kingdom come,**” we are asking God to reign in our hearts, our families, our church, our community, and our world. We are praying for darkness to be pushed back, lives to be transformed, the lost to be saved, believers to mature, and God's purposes to be accomplished. Prayer advances the Kingdom when our desires become aligned with God's desires.

Journaling Questions:

1. Where do I most need God's Kingdom rule in my own life?
2. What would change if “Your Kingdom come, Your will be done” became the priority of my prayers?
3. Who or what is God placing on my heart to pray for today?

Prayer Prompt: *Father, let Your Kingdom come and Your will be done in me, my family, TMCC, and our community. Align my heart with Yours and teach me to pray Kingdom prayers. Amen.*

TUESDAY — PRAY FOR AWAKENING: 2 Chronicles 7:14, Psalm 139:23-24

Reflection: Revival begins with God's people. Before we pray for God to change the world around us, we must allow Him to change the world within us. God calls His people to humble themselves, pray, seek His face, and turn from sin. Kingdom advancement is not accomplished by human effort alone. We desperately need a fresh movement of God. Our prayer should not merely be, “*God, change them.*” It should also be, “**God, begin with me.**” Spiritual awakening begins when God's people humble themselves and seek His face.

Journaling Questions:

1. Is there anything in my life that is hindering intimacy with God?
2. Where is God calling me to repentance or greater surrender?
3. What would spiritual awakening look like in our church and community?

Prayer Prompt: *Lord, search my heart. Forgive my sin and remove anything standing between You and me. Revive Your Church and awaken our community to Your presence. Amen.*

WEDNESDAY — PRAY FOR THE LOST AND BACKSLIDDEN: Col 4:2–6; Eph 6:18–20

Reflection: Paul repeatedly asked believers to pray for **open doors** and **bold witnesses**. That means evangelism and prayer were never intended to be separated. There are people all around us who need Jesus. Others once walked closely with Christ but have drifted away. We can pray specifically that God would soften hearts, open doors, create divine appointments, remove spiritual barriers, and give believers courage to share Jesus. Do not just pray, “**Lord, save the lost.**” Put names to your prayers. Prayer prepares hearts, opens doors, and gives God's people courage to share the Gospel.

Journaling Questions:

1. Who are three people in my life who need Jesus?
2. Who do I know who has drifted away from Christ?
3. What open door might God be giving me to encourage or share Christ with someone?

Prayer Prompt: *Father, I bring _____, _____, and _____ before You. Draw them to Jesus. Open their hearts to the Gospel and give me an opportunity and the courage to point them toward Christ. Amen.*

THURSDAY — PRAY FOR INTIMACY AND SPIRITUAL MATURITY: Eph 3:14–19; Col 1:9–14

Reflection: The goal is not simply to make converts; it is to **make disciples**. Paul's prayers for believers went beyond their circumstances. He prayed that they would know Christ more deeply, understand His love, walk worthy of Him, bear fruit, grow in their knowledge of God, and experience His power. Kingdom prayer asks God to move people from **salvation to transformation**, from spiritual infancy to maturity, and from knowing *about* Jesus to deeply **knowing Jesus**. Spiritual maturity grows out of intimacy with Jesus.

Journaling Questions:

1. Am I closer to Jesus today than I was a year ago?
2. In what area is God calling me to greater spiritual maturity?
3. Who could I intentionally pray for and encourage in their discipleship journey?

Prayer Prompt: *Jesus, draw me closer to You. Deepen my love for You and transform my character. Help me grow in faith, obedience, wisdom, and spiritual maturity. Make me more like You. Amen.*

FRIDAY — PRAY FOR HOLY SPIRIT POWER: Acts 4:29–31

Reflection: The early church faced opposition but notice what they prayed. They did not primarily ask God to remove the difficulty. They prayed for **boldness**. And God answered. The place was shaken, they were filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke God's Word boldly. The mission Jesus has given us cannot be accomplished merely through better plans, programs, personalities, or strategies. **We need the power of the Holy Spirit**. Prayer does not merely prepare us for the mission—prayer empowers us to live the mission.

Journaling Questions:

1. Where have I been relying on my own strength rather than the Holy Spirit?
2. What would Spirit-empowered boldness look like in my life?
3. What could God do through TMCC if we became increasingly dependent upon the Holy Spirit?

Prayer Prompt: *Holy Spirit, fill me and empower me. Give me courage to speak, faith to obey, and sensitivity to Your leading. Empower TMCC to advance the mission of Jesus in our community and beyond. Amen.*

SATURDAY — PRAY FOR THE HARVEST: Luke 10:2, Isaiah 6:8

Reflection: Jesus looked at people and saw a harvest. His response was striking: **pray**, “*The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.*” Then Jesus told His followers to ask the Lord of the harvest to send workers into His harvest. There is an important connection here: **we cannot sincerely pray for the harvest for very long without eventually becoming willing to enter it ourselves**. We pray for the lost. We pray for disciples. We pray for workers. And then we say, “**Lord, send me.**” Kingdom prayer eventually moves us from praying **for** the mission to participating in the mission.

Journaling Questions:

1. Where is the harvest field God has placed around me?
2. Who has God put in my life that I can intentionally reach, disciple, encourage, or serve?
3. Am I willing to become part of the answer to the prayers I have been praying this week?

Prayer Prompt: *Lord of the harvest, raise up workers. Send people into our homes, neighborhoods, schools, workplaces, community, and world with the Gospel. And Lord, I make myself available—send me. Amen.*

THE WEEKLY CHALLENGE: This week, choose **three people** who are lost, spiritually disconnected, or have drifted away from Christ. Write their names somewhere you will see them every day.

Pray specifically. Pray consistently. Pray expectantly. And each day pray, “**Father, let Your Kingdom come and Your will be done. Draw people to Jesus, mature Your disciples, empower Your Church, and send us into the harvest. Use me to advance Your mission through prayer. Amen.**”
