KEY TAKEAWAY

We give because Christ has given more than we can ever give.

ACTION STEP

Pray and ask God each morning, "How can I surrender to you more today?"

ICEBREAKERS

- What is the best physical gift (not a person) you've ever been given?

GIVING.

- When you hear the word "giving" in church, what immediately comes to mind? Why do you think conversations about giving can sometimes feel uncomfortable?
- Think about someone you would describe as genuinely generous. What makes them generous beyond simply how much money they give?

GOD IS THE GIVER. READ *EPHESIANS 1:3–14*

- How does beginning with what God has given us change the way we think about what God asks us to give?
- What happens when we begin to see our money, possessions, abilities, and opportunities as things we have received from God rather than things that ultimately belong to us?



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THE HEART OF GENEROSITY. READ 2 CORINTHIANS 9:6–9

- What do you think it actually means to be a “cheerful giver”? Does that mean generosity should never be difficult or sacrificial?
- What can our attitude toward giving reveal about our trust in God?

DIGGING DEEPER: BEYOND OUR FINANCES

Giving is often associated with money, but biblical generosity reaches far beyond our finances. God has entrusted each of us with time, abilities, relationships, possessions, opportunities, and influence that can be offered back to Him and used for the good of others.

- When you think about giving beyond your finances, what are some things God has given you that you can give to others?
- What is the difference between simply being busy serving and genuinely offering yourself to God?
- **REFLECT ON THE ANSWER TO THIS QUESTION WITHOUT ANSWERING OUT LOUD:** Which is harder for you to give generously: your money, your time, your abilities, your possessions, or your attention? Why?
