CARENOTE: MAKING SENSE OUT OF SUFFERING

We all suffer losses at times in our lives, sometimes multiple losses in rapid succession. Human beings <u>can</u> find a way to rise above the struggle of suffering, and even find some <u>positive meaning</u> in it.

CareNotes helps us to realize we live in an imperfect world, but that the same everlasting Father who cares for you today, will take care of you today, will take care of you tomorrow and everyday. Either he will shield you from suffering or he will give you unfailing strength to bear it.

"Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life." Romans 5:9-10 (NRSV)

We are tempted to see sickness and disaster as God's punishment for our failures. But, don't feel God is "out to get us." Jesus corrected his disciples on this matter, saying, "It was to let God's works show forth." God's will not about inflicting pain. God's glory is revealed in Jesus' healing grace.

"But if our injustice serves to confirm the justice of God, what should we say? That God is unjust to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.)" Romans 3:5 (NRSV)

Why then do terrible things happen in this world? God permits or allows us to suffer possibly, because God so respects our human freedom, that he will not interfere with that sacred gift of choice, even if it brings harm to us.

As human beings we will never make total sense out of the mystery of suffering. When we make destructive choices, we can't blame God for their consequences. The devastation of war does not come from God, but from the choices of human beings that are contrary to God's will.

As described by St. Jean Eudes; "you can advance farther in grace in one hour during a time of affliction, than in many days of consolidation."

Good can come from suffering. Pain can purify and humanize the heart, if we remain open to God's loving presence in our lives. When we are in the darkest part of our life, and have nowhere else to turn, we can surrender ourselves into the "hands of God", who will faithfully walk us through the dark valley.

"Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?" Romans 8:35 (NRSV)

"nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:39 (NRSV)

Jesus is with you in the midst of the storm—you are not alone. So ask for patience in suffering then, and be at peace with God, putting all anxious thoughts and worries at the foot of the cross. Jesus' love is, and always will be, with you!


