REVIEW

OBSERVE

1. Why do the saints sing in Revelation 15? (3-4)
2. On whom does the wrath of God particularly fall? (16:2)

4. How do the people experiencing God's wrath respond to it? (16:9, 11, 14 & 21)

INTERPRET

1. Revelation sees the world as a choice between following God and following humanity and Satan. What does this choice look like in our world today?
2. How does the life, death and resurrection of Jesus show us the value of following God?

ASSESS

1. How are you tempted to follow humanity and Satan rather than following God?
2. How does this passage bring hope when we question God's justice?
3. How strongly do you believe God answers prayers? How does this belief show up in your life?
4. Think back to the responses of the people experiencing God's wrath. Have you ever responded to God the way they do? What motivated that response?
5. What do you think about the idea that God is wrathful?
6. How do you think God should respond to the evil people perpetuate against one another?
