OUTLINE

Big Idea: Jesus is coming.

1. **Remain steadfast.**
2. **Wash in the blood of the Lamb.**
3. **Welcome and anticipate him.**

REVIEW

READ Revelation 22:6-21

OBSERVE

1. How is Jesus described in this passage? What do those titles mean?
2. What are the proper responses to the fact that Jesus is “coming soon”?
3. What does it mean to “keep the words of the prophecy of this book”?

INTERPRET

1. What keeps people from living like Jesus is coming quickly?
2. Why will Jesus’s return be good news?

ASSESS

1. What makes you excited about Jesus coming? What, if anything, makes you hesitant about it?
2. What do you think of when you think of the authority of God?
3. The sermon noted 4 ways Revelation calls us to remain steadfast: in our confession of faith, our love for Christ, our personal holiness and our mercy and message. Which of these do you find easiest, and which most difficult? Why?
4. Revelation says we need to wash in the blood of the Lamb. This means we are sinners who deserve death, but Jesus died to give us life. If this was your deepest belief about yourself, how would that impact your relationships with God and with people?

OUTLINE

1. The hope of eternity should make us excited. Challenge yourself this week to come up with a list of 50 reasons why you're excited for Jesus to come back.
2. When we feel the world is broken, the response of the Church in Revelation 22 is to pray "Come Lord Jesus!" Consider adopting this as a practice this week. Whenever you experience the brokenness of the world, whisper a quick prayer, "Come Lord Jesus!"
3. Where are you currently struggling to "remain steadfast" as you wait for Jesus? What step can you take to grow in steadfastness?
4. If you've washed in the blood of the Lamb, you've been forgiven much at great cost. Who do you need to forgive as you've been forgiven? What do you need to do to approach people with grace and humility because you've been forgiven?
5. Are there any other steps of obedience God is calling you to from the sermon?
