INTRODUCTION

6. The sermon mentions Isaiah's vision being obscured by King Uzziah. Have you ever had a similar experience where admiration for a leader clouded your view of God or yourself?
7. What does it mean for Jesus to be "greater" than other religious figures or cultural icons? How does this impact the way we view and interact with the world around us?
8. How can we ensure that we're truly listening to Jesus amidst all the noise and voices in our world today?
9. What was your biggest takeaway from the message, and why?
