INTRODUCTION

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

4. Discuss the significance of Jesus "sitting down" after his sacrifice. How does this contrast with the work of earthly priests, and what does it mean for us today?
5. The sermon touches on the concept of Jesus as Prophet, Priest, and King. How do these roles help us understand Jesus' ministry and his relationship to us?
6. What are some practical ways we can acknowledge and respond to Jesus' supremacy in our daily lives?
7. As you go about your week, consciously remind yourself that Jesus is holding all things together. How might this change your perspective on challenges you face?
8. What was your biggest takeaway from the message, and why?
