



WEEK #3: YOU'RE INVITED

INTRODUCTION

There is something large in everyone's life. For some, it's money or sports. For others, it's a career, or politics, or social media. But no matter how big we make those things, they will always be so much smaller than Jesus. He will always be more. He will always come through. He's the only one worthy of our worship, and we're called to lift him up. Let's *Magnify Him*.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. The woman in Mark 5 faced a problem that was embarrassing, lonely, bankrupting, painful, and slowly killing her. Which of these aspects resonates most with struggles you've faced or are facing?
2. The sermon compared her physical condition to our spiritual condition of sin. How does viewing sin through these five lenses (embarrassing, lonely, bankrupting, painful, deadly) change your perspective on it?
3. Why do you think we try to hide our problems from God when he already knows everything about us?
4. The woman had heard about Jesus, and that changed everything for her. How has "Hearing about Jesus" changed your perspective on your problems?
5. The sermon suggested she might have faced opposition from friends, in-laws, financial advisors, or negative people. What voices in your life make it harder to bring your problems to Jesus? How do you "block them out"?
6. Jesus stopped everything to acknowledge this woman publicly. What does this tell you about how he values you and your problems?
7. The woman "could not stay hidden" and had to tell her whole story to the crowd (Luke 8:47). Why do you think Jesus wanted her story made public? What role does testimony play in our healing?
8. The sermon emphasized the word "ALL" in the key verses—all people, all problems, all anxieties. What problem have you been hesitant to bring to Jesus because you thought it was too small, too big, or too embarrassing?
9. What was your biggest takeaway from the message, and why?
