\* The paschal candle (*paschal* means related to Easter) is a symbol of the presence of the risen Christ among his people. Normally the paschal candle is placed near the baptismal font and is lit only for baptisms and funerals. During the season of Easter it is located in the chancel near the altar and is lit for every service.

## Easter Dialogue

Christ is risen!

**He is risen indeed!**

This good news of Easter has been ringing out around the world ever since the women who went to Jesus' tomb found that it was empty. The angel said to them, **“Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said.”**

*Matthew 28:5,6*

Because Jesus' tomb is empty, our lives are full of peace. Jesus' resurrection proves his payment for sin on the cross was sufficient. Our lives would otherwise be full of shame and guilt, but Jesus was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification.

*Romans 4:25*

**It was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect. Through him you believe in God, who raised him from the dead and glorified him.**

*1 Peter 1:18-20*

Because Jesus' tomb is empty, our lives are full of certainty. Jesus' resurrection validates every claim he made about himself and certifies every promise he has made to us. Our lives would otherwise be full of doubt and darkness, but Jesus was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead.

*Romans 1:4*  
*1 Peter 2:4,6*

**Jesus is the living Stone, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame.**

Because Jesus' tomb is empty, our lives are full of hope. Jesus' resurrection guarantees that we, too, will rise from our graves. Our lives would otherwise be full of despair and gloom, but Jesus has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

1 Corinthians 15:1–11

<sup>1</sup>Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. <sup>2</sup>By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

*The resurrection is of first importance to the gospel of Jesus Christ, the gospel to which we hold firmly and are saved.*

<sup>3</sup>For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, <sup>4</sup>that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, <sup>5</sup>and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. <sup>6</sup>After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. <sup>7</sup>Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, <sup>8</sup>and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

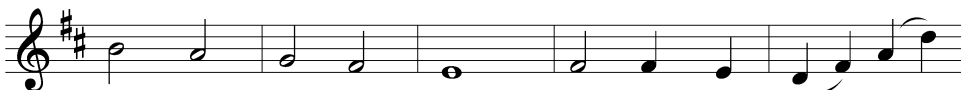

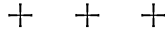
