Eusevio's Story of Restoration

Eusevio arrived at His Mansion in February of 2025. For 25 years, he battled addiction to drugs. At 36 years of age, it was time for a real change. Eusevio knew he needed lasting help. He knew without a real transformation, he would return to his addiction. He had been there before, several times in fact. Despite a period of sobriety that spanned 5 years when he was younger, and another 2 years of sobriety due to a jail sentence, he inevitably relapsed. Deep down, Eusevio knew his life was missing something. So he sought the help of a Christian program even though he didn't believe in God. Recalling the state of his heart upon entering the Resident Recovery Program, he said, "I was my own God."

Eusevio grew up in a loving Christian home in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The son of first-generation immigrants, he believed he needed to outperform his classmates in order to succeed and find acceptance. Eventually, the pressure for approval drove Eusevio to the local gangs in his neighborhood. There, he found the acceptance he was craving and began drinking and using marijuana by the age of 11. Soon, he was selling even harder drugs, like opiates and cocaine, which, in time, he found himself addicted to. Still, Eusevio considered himself "functional" and continued in a life of crime and addiction while also pursuing higher education at Marquette University and a promising career.

Try as he may, Eusevio could not outrun his addiction. As the years passed, the price he paid for his choices began to add up. In his addiction, Eusevio suffered the loss of his education as he was forced to withdraw from school only 3 weeks prior to graduation. He lost his career, a long-term relationship and his home. Eventually, he even lost his freedom after his crimes caught up with him, and he spent 2 years behind bars. He recalls hitting his lowest point when he realized his parents had lost all hope for him to change. The Lord used this loss of his family's respect as the catalyst to reach Eusevio, and soon a search for help led him to His Mansion's website.

Eusevio came to The Hill as a self-described "non-believer and skeptic" and remembers his beliefs being challenged by the way he was welcomed into the His Mansion community. "When I arrived, I was shocked to find people who did not want anything from me. They simply showed me the love and grace God showed them every day," he recalls. As he saw how God was working through the people at His Mansion, he was no longer able to deny the reality of a God who loves and forgives him. Eusevio accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized later that summer.

As Jesus rebuilds Eusevio's life, the losses he endured while in his addiction are being restored. Christ has brought reconciliation to his family and given him a new home, genuine friendships and true freedom that can only be experienced in Jesus. Now, as a Servant Leader, Eusevio believes his purpose in life is "to bring other people to Christ." Jesus has transformed a story of loss into a story of restoration.
