The life-giving message of the Gospel, the passion and joy of Sunday services, and the simple style of Dreamer's Church has connected immediately with the people of Austin. At the same time, we helped other church planters in the city and gave over ten percent of our income to missions/church planting.

We invite you to see for yourself how exciting church can be when the focus is simple, and people are free to seek God with passion. So come dream! Dream with God, dream with others and dream again. Our God loves transforming the lives of broken dreamers into something beautiful beyond recognition.

LIFE IN AUSTIN

Austin is a vibrant, lively city, with a distinct, creative culture. The University of Texas, Austin, is right near the heart of downtown, and as a result, the city is full of young families and college-age young men and women. College sports are a big deal here in Austin, so buy your Longhorns apparel at your nearest team store and you'll fit right in!

Named the capital of Texas in 1839, the beautiful Texas State Capitol Building adds to the beauty of the Downtown Austin area. LIFE ON CAMPUS

ATTENDANCE

We expect that in committing to Dreamer’s Bible College, you are also committing to being in attendance for at least 80% of the scheduled contact hours. Students are responsible for recording their attendance by signing into Populi software at the start of each day. You will also be required to fill in a Leave Application form for requesting time away from classes.

DEVOTIONS

Devotions is a time where students come together weekly to seek God, have praise and worship and receive a message from Dreamer’s Church staff and guest speakers. You are required to attend Dreamer’s Bible College devotions.

SMALL GROUPS

Each student will be involved in attending a young adult’s small group. Participation is twice monthly and is a required part of the Dreamer’s Bible College.

COUNSELLING & PASTORAL CARE

Dreamer’s Church staff is available for you to talk to in the case of counselling and pastoral care matters. In the instance that you are not satisfactorily meeting our attendance expectation, our staff will schedule an appointment with you to discuss why, and how we can best assist you to make the most out of your time as a student.

GRADUATION

Dreamer’s Bible College graduation services are held at the end of the Dreamer’s Bible College semester in May. This includes a Sunday graduation service and a graduation dinner with students, and Dreamer’s Church staff. Attendance at these events is mandatory for all students.

TUITION, FEES, AND PAYMENT POLICIES

DREAMER'S BIBLE COLLEGE TUITION COSTS

Dreamer's Bible College offers both full time and part time enrollment options to provide flexibility for students in different seasons of life and ministry preparation.

Full Time Enrollment

Full time students are required to enroll in 12 to 16 credit hours per semester. Tuition for full time enrollment is a flat rate of \$2,400 per semester. Any credits taken beyond 16 credit hours will be billed at \$200 per additional credit hour. All required textbooks and course materials are included in the cost of tuition and are built into the per credit pricing.

Part Time Enrollment

Part time enrollment is available at a rate of \$250 per credit hour. Part time students are required to participate in a minimum of 50 percent in person class attendance, with the option to complete up to 50 percent of coursework online, depending on course availability and approval. All required textbooks and course materials are included in the cost of tuition and are built into the per credit pricing.

SEU (South Eastern University) Credits

For those looking to do dual enrollment with SEU (South Eastern University), there are additional costs that typically run about \$1300 extra per semester. SEU fully accepts all DBC credits and requires 25% credits be issued from SEU for the degree programs they offer. To get detailed pricing you will need to meet with our college administrator to see what additional classes you will need.

COURSE FEES

In addition to tuition, the following fees apply:

- Registration Fee: \$100 per semester
- Logos Bible Software Fee: \$200 (one-time freshman year only)
- Missions Trip Fee: Optional and assessed only for students who choose to participate in the annual mission trip
- International students should also be aware of the additional international student work regulations under the B1/B2 Visa.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

A minimum of 50 percent of the semester tuition is due on Orientation Day. The remaining balance may be divided into three or four scheduled payments throughout the semester. Detailed payment schedules will be provided prior to the start of each term.

LIVING COSTS

Students are responsible to find and pay for their living arrangements. We do have some dorm options available, recommended housing providers, but the final choice is up to you where you will live.

Dreamer's Church does not guarantee dorm accommodation. We have organized student accommodation in the Central Austin area for around \$900 a month, however rooms are limited. Please email admin@dreamers.church for further information regarding this student accommodation. TRAVEL COSTS

Fall Semester

Full time students will travel to Portland, Oregon, in October to attend the Ministers Fellowship International Conference for three days. Travel and lodging expenses are included in full time tuition. Students are responsible for covering the cost of meals and personal expenses, which typically total approximately \$100.

Spring Semester

Full time students will travel to Spokane, Washington, to join Sun City College for three days of live, collaborative classes. Travel and lodging expenses are included in full time tuition. Students are responsible for covering the cost of meals and personal expenses, which typically total approximately \$100.

Missions Trips

Optional missions trips are offered each year for students who choose to participate. It is the desire of Dreamer's Bible College that every student participate in at least one missions trip during their two-year college experience.

Additional Travel

The student will be responsible for any travel costs to Austin, Texas and visits throughout their course.

Dreamer's Bible College launches on August 20, 2026 and runs through May 23, 2027. We could not be more expectant for what God is going to do in this next year. This is more than a school calendar. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

STUDENT VISA REQUIREMENTS

For student coming from another country, we provide you paperwork after approval into the Dreamer's Bible College for applying for your B1/B2 Visa.

EDUCATION, YOUR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITY

The United States Government wants overseas students in America to have a safe and rewarding place to study. United States laws promote quality education and consumer protection for overseas students and requires them to have a US citizenship or approved VISA. You will be required to stay in good standing with the VISA you come to America on.

WORKING IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

International students and their dependents applying for student visas for the first time will not automatically be granted permission to work in America. Students and their dependents will only be able to apply for a visa with work rights after they arrive in America and the student has begun their course of study and there are no guarantees that a visa with work rights will be granted. You therefore need to be sure that you have sufficient funds to support yourself and any family members for your entire stay in America.

Where work rights are granted, students are limited to 20 hours work per week while their American education provider is in session, but they may work full time during holiday breaks. Work rights are intended to be only a supplement to a student's support rather than their sole source of support.

ARRIVAL ARRANGEMENTS

Dreamer's Bible College is happy to arrange pick up to first time arrival international students, during office hours. Please notify the Dreamer's Church office of your flight number, arrival time and accommodation arrangements two weeks prior to your arrival. A Dreamer's Church representative will meet you upon arrival and drive you to your accommodation.

BIBLE COLLEGE CODE OF CONDUCT

A fundamental goal of Dreamer's Bible College is to foster an environment in which its members may live and work productively together to see growth and development of Christian character both in and outside of Dreamer's Bible College settings. Since students are also being trained for Christian ministry and are engaged in ministry as part of their course, it is expected that they will conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the standards expected of Christian leaders and ministers, and the churches in which they are ministering and being trained. Students are expected to be familiar with the student Code of Conduct. These serve as the guidelines forming the protection of each individual's well-being. Whenever violations of the rules occur, our Pastors will treat them as matters of serious concern because they disrupt the individual lives of students, and the shared life of this Dreamer's Bible College.

Each student is expected to:

- Avoid attitudes and behavior that disrupts the unity and health of the Dreamer's Bible College
- Show respect and consideration for other students and their property
- Show respect for staff
- Attend all Dreamer's Bible College and ministry sessions and activities by the Dreamer's Bible College and church.
- Pass all Bible College classes, and have all papers and projects turned in on time.
- Refrain from dishonest academic practices
- Abstain from alcohol and smoking.
- Be neat, clean and modestly dressed.
- Maintain a lifestyle that is beyond reproach (including, but not limited to abstaining from sexual immorality, abstaining from substance abuse, etc.)

HEALTH AND SAFETY

RESPONSIBILITIES OF DREAMER'S BIBLE COLLEGE

- Provide a safe study place and environment.
- Implement work practices consistent with the extent of their control over or influence on college conditions and methods.
- Promote actively and be involved in those policies and procedures.
- Provide the resources required to satisfy the Dreamer's Bible College OHS commitments.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTARY WORKERS AND STUDENTS

- Follow all OHS policies and procedures.
- Report all hazards identified to the staff.
- Comply with lawful instructions.
- Not behave in a willful and reckless manner.

HOW TO REPORT A SAFETY ISSUE OR COMPLAINT

All accidents, near-misses or any issue to do with safety should be reported immediately to a pastor or leader. Always follow up with a written email to info@dreamers.church describing the issue and who you talked to. Serious accidents must be reported within 24 hours to a staff member.

HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES

- No smoking in/around Dreamer's Church buildings.
- No alcohol or drugs on Dreamer's Church property.
- Know and observe all OHS rules.
- Know and observe details of emergency response and evacuation plans.
- All work at heights must have the permission of the OHS coordinator before commencement. Safety equipment is essential and can be obtained from the coordinator.
- Do not undertake work for which you are not qualified. ex. Electrical maintenance.
- Take responsibility for own OHS by not doing anything that may endanger you or a fellow employee/voluntary worker/student.
- Report all potential hazards or accidents and incidents to the OHS coordinator.
- Always keep work areas neat and tidy.
- If required to lift any items likely to cause injury, seek assistance before proceeding.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURES – GENERAL

All students are required to follow the instructions of building managers, security or emergency services. On hearing an alarm or being informed by building managers, please exit the building via the nearest emergency exit and assemble in the allocated building assembly area. Information on assembly areas is displayed in all buildings. You must not enter or walk through an alarmed building or area. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with emergency procedures.

- On hearing an evacuation alarm, or on instruction of emergency control personnel, immediately cease all activity and secure personal valuables.
- Assist any person in immediate danger, but only if safe to do so.
- If practical, and only if safe to do so, secure any activity or process that may become hazardous or suffer damage if left unattended as a consequence of evacuation.
- Act in accordance with directions given by emergency control personnel and evacuate the building immediately.
- Assist with the general evacuation if directed to do so by emergency control personnel.
- Assist with the evacuation of disabled occupants.
- In a fire, do not use an elevator to evacuate a building.
- Move calmly to the nominated evacuation assembly area and do not leave the evacuation assembly area until all clear has been given.
- Follow the instructions of relevant emergency services personnel and campus emergency control personnel.

DREAMER'S BIBLE COLLEGE POLICIES

1.11. Attendance Policy

Regular attendance is required in all Dreamer's Bible College functions

1.12. Course Progress Revised

Dreamer's Bible College Director and/or admin will meet at random with students to review where they are at in each class, church involvement, and personal Dreamer's Bible College goals.

1.13. Complaints Process

All complaints are to be directed to the Dreamer's Bible College Director.

1.14. Drinking Policy

All students are expected to abstain from alcohol while enrolled in classes at Dreamer's Bible College. During Christmas break and summer break students are expected to obey all laws and live above reproach.

1.15. Refund Policy

- a. Application fees, accommodation booking fee and airport pick-up fee are non-refundable.
- b. Tuition fees are refunded in full, only if the student's visa application is rejected. Student must provide Dreamer's Church with a written notification and a copy of documents evidencing the refusal.
- c. Tuition fees will be refunded less a cancellation fee of 25% of that semester's tuition provided that the written intention to withdraw from a course is received 28 days or more prior to the course start date.
- d. If written notice of your intention to withdraw from a course is received less than 28 days prior to the course commencement date, tuition fees will be refunded less a cancellation fee of 50% of that semester's tuition.
- e. Dreamer's Church will not authorize the transfer of fees to other institutions or any other student's account
- f. Bank charges for refunds made by check, bank draft or electronic transfer will be deducted from the refund amount.
- g. All refunds will be made within 30 days after Dreamer's Church receives a written refund claim
- h. No refunds will be given to students who provide false or misleading information to the Dreamer's Bible College .
- i. No refunds will be made after the start date of the course. No refund will be made if a student fails to comply with the conditions of enrollment or any breach of the visa requirements imposed by the United States Government

DOCTRINE OF THE CHURCH | Credits: 2

Monday – 11:00 – 12:00 PM & Wednesday – 11:00 – 12:00 PM

Doctrine of the Church is a comprehensive biblical study of the Church's purpose, place, and significance. It provides a theological foundation for understanding the value of the Church, both in its historical context as well as in today's world.

PENTATEUCH | Credits: 3

Tuesday – 11:00 – 12:00 PM & Thursday – 11:00 – 12:00 PM

Pentateuch is the study of the first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. This course will help you understand how these books relate to Old Testament history and the eternal purpose of God.

DISCOVER PURPOSE | Credit: 2

Monday – 1:00 – 2:00 PM

This course is a personal journey helping you grow in your understanding of the gifts and calling God has placed on your life. More than simply learning concepts, you will be anchored in your true identity in Christ, rooted in who He says you are and confident in how He has uniquely fashioned you.

HOMILETICS | Credits: 3

Monday – 9:00 – 11:00 AM

In this course the student is taught the process of building and utilizing outlines, texts, illustrations, word studies, background information, and dramatic dialogues for effectively preaching the Word of God.

HUMAN DEVELOPMENT | Credits: 3

Tuesday – 12:00 – 1:00 PM & Thursday – 12:00 – 1:00 PM

A course dealing with the roles of men and women in society and how the individual functions within the group process. Strong emphasis is placed upon the necessity and dynamics of strong interpersonal relationships in all areas of life.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY | Credits: 3

Tuesday – 10:00 – 11:00 AM & Thursday – 10:00 – 11:00 AM

Students will be exposed both practically and philosophically how to apply their faith and values to help shape the institutions of society like government, public policy, politics, news and media, entertainment, medicine, education and the courts.

PRACTICUM | Credits: 1

Wednesday – 1:00 & 2:00 pm

Each student will **serve one hour per week** in a strategic ministry area, learning firsthand from the pastoral staff what it means to build the local church, love people well, and lead with excellence.
