What You Need

-  "Circle Creations" Activity Page 1
-  Coloring supplies 1

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Print "Circle Creations" on cardstock, one per kid.

During the Activity:

- Welcome kids by name with a high-five, fist bump, smile, or wave as they arrive.
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Give each kid a "Circle Creations" Activity Page, a clipboard, and coloring supplies.
- Point out all the empty circles on the page.
- Challenge the kids: "Your job is to turn these simple circles into something totally new and different. What can a circle become?"
- Encourage their creativity by giving a few examples: A circle could become the sun, the wheel on a car, a smiley face, a basketball, or a ladybug.
- Give them several minutes to draw and transform their circles into a page full of unique creations.
- When they're done, invite them to share their favorite creation with the group.

What You Say:

"These are so creative! You started with just plain circles, and you turned them into all these amazing new things. That's kind of what God does in our lives. He can take any situation—even a hard or confusing one—and turn it into something good. Today, we're going to hear a Bible Story that reminds us **[Bottom Line] God can use all things**. Let's go!"

Opener game | Foil Sculpt-Off**What You Need**

What You Say:**OPENER**

HOST: "Hey, everyone! I'm so glad you're here today. Welcome back to 'Masterpiece!' The full name of our series this month is 'Masterpiece—Made by God,' and we've been talking about how God made you and how He made you with a purpose!

"If this is your first time, we're so happy you came—get ready for something really fun!

"But before we dive in today, let's get the energy up. Everyone, stand up! Turn to someone nearby, and give them the loudest, happiest 'Good morning!' you've got!

(Pause while kids talk to their neighbor.)

"Now, high-five someone who's wearing your favorite color.

(Pause while kids high-five each other.)

"Okay, now shout out your favorite kind of pizza on three. Ready? One ... two ... three!

(Pause while kids shout out their favorite kind of pizza.)

"Delicious! I love it. You all came ready today!

"It's time for our opening game, and it's a creative challenge.

"It's called ... 'Foil Sculpt-Off!'

What You Say:*GAME SLIDE 1: Foil Sculpt-Off Title*

"Here's how it works: I'm going to need four volunteers. Each one gets a sheet of tinfoil, and your job is to sculpt something with it! You'll have 30 seconds to create your best version of an object I will tell you to make.

"Everyone else, your job is to cheer them on! Sound good?

"Let's pick our volunteers! Raise your hand if you want to play 'Foil Sculpt-Off!'"

(Pick four volunteers from the kids who have their hands raised, invite them to stand behind the table in the game area, and give each kid a sheet of tinfoil.)

"Okay, for this round, you're creating ... a fish!"

"Ready? GO!"

Optional Video: 30-Second Countdown

(Start 30-second timer. Play the game.)

"Time's up! Okay, sculptors, hold up your creations nice and high. Let's hear it from the crowd—cheer if you think this one looks the most like a fish!"

(Allow each kid to hold up their tinfoil creations, and let the audience vote on which one they like best by cheering. Whichever creation gets the loudest cheer from the audience is the winner. Declare and celebrate the winner.)

"Looks like this tinfoil creation is our winner! Let's give a big hand for ALL of our sculptors! Thank you, friends! You guys can take your seats."

(Continue with more rounds as time allows. Ask for four new volunteers and hand out four new sheets of tinfoil at the start of each round. Other ideas for the kids to sculpt: a flower, a mountain, a phone, a pizza, sunglasses, headphones.)

"You all crushed it! We've definitely got some creatives in the room today. You never know what's going to happen in [Environment Name]!"

"Today, we're talking about how God made each of us with a purpose. This is so important for all of us to understand. Our Bottom Line today talks about this—let's take a look!"

KIDS AND HOST: *[Bottom Line]* "God made me for a purpose."

HOST: "Awesome job, friends! We will be talking more about that very soon!"

All right guest what time it is ? Its time to worship!

Worship is one of the best things we get to do together. It's a chance to sing, move, and thank God just for being who He is.

"You don't have to sing perfectly. You don't even have to know all the moves. It's more about us coming together and saying, 'I love You, God. You are number one in my life!'

"Each month, we take time to focus on one verse from the Bible. Why? Because God's Word is full of truth. It reminds us who God is, and it also reminds us who we are. This verse isn't just words we try to memorize—it's something we can believe and live out.

"This month, our Memory Verse comes from the book of Psalms. I'll read it first, then I will lead you through it!

SLIDE: Memory Verse

LEADER: "How you made me is amazing and wonderful. I praise you for that. What you have done is wonderful. I know that very well (Psalm 139:14 NirV).

"Now, let me guide you through it. Repeat after me—nice and loud!

LEADER: *"How you made me"*

What You Say:

Leader: "Let's talk to God together, friends. You can bow your heads and close your eyes."

Kids, have you ever made a mistake? Maybe you disobeyed your parents, were unkind to a friend, or told a lie.

The Bible calls those things sin. Every one of us has sinned—even grown-ups! Sin separates us from God, and no matter how hard we try, we can't fix that problem on our own.

SLIDE: Theme

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Print "Story Pictures" on cardstock and cut, one set per Small Group.
- Create a long timeline on the floor with tape.
- Place ONE quarter-piece from each of the four pictures along the timeline in the correct story order. This piece will act as the "clue."
- Create a large, mixed-up pile of all the other picture pieces on a table or in the center of the room.

During the Activity:

- Explain the game: "On the floor is a timeline of Moses' life, but the pictures are incomplete. Your job is to work together to find the missing pieces from the pile and complete each picture on the timeline to build the story."
- On "Go," have kids look through the pile to find the pieces that match their clues on the timeline and assemble the full pictures in the correct order.
- Open the Bible and read Romans 8:28-29.
- Share the following key points:
 - These verses are part of a letter that Paul wrote to the followers of Jesus who lived in Rome.
 - Paul was sharing an important truth about God: In the life of a Jesus-follower, God works all things for good!

What You Say:

"Great job! Look at this timeline. Moses' life had a lot of different pieces, right? Some were good, and some were really hard. But did God use all of those pieces? Absolutely. Every single part of his story was used by God to prepare

him for his purpose. God used all the experiences Moses faced to bring about good!

"You may know people who have seen God work something good from the hard things they faced. You may have even experienced it yourself. Perhaps you were super-anxious about starting at a new school—but then, you made a new friend you wouldn't have met without moving schools. Once you see where God has worked in your life before, you can trust that He will continue to be at work when you face something new.

"When we choose to love God and give our lives to Him, we can be confident that He will bring good out of everything we've experienced and everything we've done. This doesn't mean God *causes* hard things to happen—but it does mean that God is so good and powerful, He can work good through every single thing in our lives. No matter what pieces are in our story, **[Bottom Line] God can use all things** for good for those who love Him."

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Create two sets of playing cards by writing each word or phrase of the Memory Verse on index cards.
- Place a loop of tape on the back of each card.

During the Activity:

- Give every kid a Bible.
- Invite them to look up Psalm 139:14 using the Bible Navigation Tips below:

Finding verses with 4th-5th graders: Ask kids to tell you if the book of the Bible they're looking for is in the Old Testament or New Testament. If it's in the Old, instruct kids to flip slowly, starting at the front of the Bible and heading toward the back, until they find the book they're looking for. If it's in the New, instruct kids to start flipping from the back, going forward to find the book they're looking for. Once they

find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. First, have them find the chapter they're looking for. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell kids to find the verse within the chapter they've already found.

- Read the Memory Verse out loud together several times.
- Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
- Invite the kids to set their Bibles aside.
- Divide the group into two teams, and have them form lines on one side of the room.
- Give each team their shuffled set of verse cards.
- Explain the rules: "This is a relay race to build our Memory Verse on the wall. The first person in line will take their word of the verse, run to the wall, and stick it on where they think it goes. Then they'll run back and tag the next person, who will run and place their word on the wall where they think it goes in the verse, and so on. Once all the cards are on the wall, each team will send one teammate to the wall to rearrange any words of the verse."
- The first team to get the whole Memory Verse on the wall in the correct order wins!
- The verse to assemble: *How you made me is amazing and wonderful. I praise you for that. What you have done is wonderful. I know that very well (Psalm 139:14 NIV).*

What You Say:

"Awesome job! That took speed and teamwork! Knowing this verse is like having a secret weapon. When things get hard or confusing, you can remember that God made you one of a kind! Our Memory Verse says: *How you made me is amazing and wonderful. I praise you for that. What you have done is wonderful. I know that very well (Psalm 139:14 NIV).*

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Print "Heart Tangram" on red cardstock and cut, one per Small Group.

During the Activity:

- Give each kid a piece of the tangram and a writing utensil.
- If there are extra pieces of the tangram that aren't given out, allow kids to take additional pieces, or feel free to leave some pieces blank. (Or the leader can fill one out too!) Instruct them to write or draw a picture of that thing on their tangram piece. Make sure to have kids write their name as well.
- As you assemble the pieces, talk about each one, and gently remind the kids that God knows about the hard things, and He will use them for good.

What You Say:

"It's okay to have hard things happen in our lives. Moses did too. But the most important thing to remember is that the very good God is with us, and He is using that hard thing for good. He can take all the different pieces of our life—the happy parts and the sad parts—and put them together to make something beautiful, just like how these pieces make a heart. Let's pray and ask God to help us trust Him with all the pieces of our lives."
