Beach Ball Challenge

What You Need

-  Floor tape 1
-  Beach ball 1
-  Pool noodles 1

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Use the floor tape to mark a start line and a finish line on opposite sides of the room.
- Inflate the beach ball.

During the Activity:

- Welcome kids by name with a high-five, fist bump, smile, or wave as they arrive.
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Ask for two kids to volunteer to go first.
- Give each volunteer a pool noodle, and place the beach ball on the floor between them.
- Explain the challenge: They must work together to carry the beach ball from the start line to the finish line using only their pool noodles. They cannot touch the ball with their hands.
- Encourage the rest of the group to cheer them on.
- If they drop the ball, they can pick it up with their pool noodles and keep going.
- Ask for two more volunteers, and let them try.
- Continue until everyone who wants a turn has had one.

What You Say:

"Great teamwork! That was tricky, but you worked together to get the job done! It would have been impossible for one person to do that alone. In our Bible Story today, we're going to hear about a really big project that God's people had to do. It was so big, they all had to work together to build it. Let's go find out what it was!"

Opener game | Make It in a Minute

What You Need

No supplies needed

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, everyone! Welcome! I'm really glad you're here. If it's your first time with us, jump on in. You picked a good day to be here!"

"We're continuing our theme for the month, 'Masterpiece'! The full name of our series this month is 'Masterpiece—Made by God,' and we've been talking all about how we are God's masterpiece and His most special creation!"

"Before we jump into our game, I need you to think like a builder for a second—a very creative builder."

"Turn to someone next to you, and tell them what you would build if someone gave you a pile of random craft supplies and only one minute. You have five seconds. Go!"

(Pause while kids talk to each other.)

"Love it! I hear the creativity in the room!"

"Alright, now we're doing it for real. It's officially game time. Today's game is called 'Make It in a Minute!'"

What You Say:

GAME SLIDE 1: Make It in a Minute Title

"I need four volunteers for Round One. If you like creating, raise your hand!"

(Choose four kids from the ones who have their hands raised, invite them to the game area, and have each of them stand behind the table at a craft station.)

"Here's the deal: You get one minute to create anything you want. There's no theme or specifics. This is your chance to use your imaginations! When the timer ends, you'll freeze and hold your creation up for everyone to see.

"Everyone watching, I want to hear you cheering!

"Creators, you ready? Audience ready? Let's go!

"Three, two, one, build!

Optional Video: One-Minute Countdown

(Start one-minute timer. Allow the kids to work on their craft until the one-minute timer is up.)

"And, time! Freeze. Go ahead and hold up your crafts for everyone to see!

"Alright, creators, I want to hear your description of what you made. Let's start with our first volunteer!

(Allow each kid to share a description of their craft.)

"Wow! Let's give our creators a huge hand! You guys can take a seat.

(As time allows, continue with more rounds. Select four new volunteers at the start of each round.)

"Here's what I love about this game: Everyone had the same supplies but made totally different creations. It's so cool to see!

"Okay, now that we're warmed up, let's check out our Bottom Line for today!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "God grows His gifts in me to build His kingdom. Can you say that with me?"

"Each month, we take time to focus on one verse from the Bible. Why? Because God's Word is full of truth. It reminds us who God is, and it also reminds us who we are. This verse isn't just words we try to memorize—it's something we can believe and live out.

"This month, our Memory Verse comes from the book of Psalms. I'll read it first, then I will lead you through it!

SLIDE: Memory Verse

LEADER: *"How you made me is amazing and wonderful. I praise you for that. What you have done is wonderful. I know that very well (Psalm 139:14 NirV).*

"Now, let me guide you through it. Repeat after me—nice and loud!

LEADER: *"How you made me"*

KIDS AND LEADER: *"How you made me"*

What You Say:

Leader: "Let's talk to God together, friends. You can bow your heads and close your eyes."

Kids, have you ever made a mistake? Maybe you disobeyed your parents, were unkind to a friend, or told a lie.

The Bible calls those things sin. Every one of us has sinned—even grown-ups! Sin separates us from God, and no matter how hard we try, we can't fix that problem on our own.

That's why we need Jesus. Jesus loves us so much that He came to take the punishment for our sins so we could be close to God and have eternal life with Him.

Maybe you've heard about Jesus before, but you've never personally asked Him to be your forever friend. Today, you can make that choice.

If you have never asked Jesus to be your forever friend, and today you want to say 'yes' to Jesus, raise your hand right now."

(Pause and look for raised hands.)

"That's amazing! Let's all pray together. Repeat after me:
READ THE ABC PRAYER

(Tech Crew) Slides A, B, C

Leaders read each slide and have kids repeat after you.

SMALL GROUP ACTIVITY ONE

Tabernacle Trek

What You Need

 Floor tape

1

 Balloons

1

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Create a start line and a finish line on opposite sides of your group space with tape.

During the Activity:

- Divide your group into one or two large teams.
- Instruct each team to line up single file behind the start line.
- Give each team enough balloons so they can place one between each kid in line (one less than the number of kids on the team).
- Demonstrate how the first two kids will hold a balloon between them (chest to back) without using their hands. Have the rest of the team do the same, creating a long "caterpillar."
- Explain the challenge: On "Go!", the team must work together to walk like a caterpillar from the start line to the finish line without dropping any balloons.
- Share the rules:
- No hands allowed! You can only hold the balloons by pressing them between each other.
- If a balloon drops, the entire caterpillar must stop, work together to put it back in place, and then continue.
- Encourage the kids to talk to each other and move at the same speed.
- Cheer them on as they trek across the room!

What You Say:

"Awesome job, everyone! That was tricky, wasn't it? What did you have to do to keep the balloons from falling? *(Invite responses: talk to each other, walk slowly, stay close together)* You had to cooperate! This is a great picture of what it was like for God's people to build the tabernacle. God gave some people the gift of working with metal, some

the gift of sewing, and some the gift of working with wood. Some people even had the metal, the fabric, and the wood to contribute to the project! Everyone used what God had given them, and they all carefully worked together to build a special place for God.

"Just like God's people had the assignment of building the tabernacle, you have the assignment of showing God's good heart and pointing to His kingdom. What you have—things like your abilities, your time, and your possessions—are gifts from God that He wants you to use. He's given you what you have for exactly this time! When you use what God has given you together with what He has given other people, you can do even more amazing things for God. Remember that **[Bottom Line] God grows His gifts in me to build His kingdom.**"

**[Make It Personal]* (Share an age-appropriate story about a time you were part of a team effort for God. For example, you can share something like: "One time at church, we had to get a room ready for a big party. I'm not very good at decorating, but I am good at organizing! So my friends who are good at art made all the decorations, and I helped figure out where everything should go. We used our different gifts together to get the job done, and it was so much better than if I had tried to do it all by myself!")*

Kick the Cup Verse

What You Need

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Write one word or short phrase of the Memory Verse on each sticker, and place one sticker on each cup.

During the Activity:

- Give every kid a Bible, and direct them to look up Psalm 139:14.
- Demonstrate how to look up the Memory Verse using the Bible Navigation Tips below:

Finding verses for 2nd-3rd graders: Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find the name of the book in the list. When they find the book, lead them to look at the page number beside it. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find that book. Help the kids find the page. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find the correct chapter. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find the correct verse in that chapter.

- Repeat the Memory Verse out loud together several times.
- Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
- Invite the kids to set their Bibles aside.
- Create a line of floor tape.
- A few feet away from the floor tape, line up the verse cups in order on the floor. Read the verse together.
- Divide the group into pairs. Have the first pair come up and stand behind the line of floor tape.
- Explain the game: One partner (the "Kicker") will gently kick the ball to try and knock over as many cups as they can.
- The other partner (the "Reader") then has to say the Memory Verse, using the words on the cups that are still standing as clues to figure out which words are missing.
- The group can help if the Reader gets stuck.
- After they solve it, set the cups back up, and let the partners switch roles.

What You Say:

"Great job! That was a fun way to practice our verse. You had to work together to figure out the missing words. Our Memory Verse is all about how we can praise God for the amazing and wonderful way He made us. God made our eyes, hair, and ears. God gave each of us different gifts and abilities, and God does not make mistakes! God gives us gifts to build His kingdom."

What You Do:

Before the Activity:

- Draw a simple tower on the paper, and write "Building God's Kingdom" at the top of the paper.
- Tape to the wall at a kid's height.

During the Activity:

- Give each kid a sticky note and a pencil or crayon.
- Ask them to think of one special gift God has given them. It could be helping, singing, playing sports, drawing, being kind, or sharing.
- If they need help, offer suggestions.
- Have them draw a simple picture of their gift on their sticky note.
- Invite each kid to come up, tell the group what their gift is, and add their sticky note to the tower outline on the paper.
- Watch as the tower is "built" with all of their amazing gifts.

What You Say:

"Look at this incredible tower we are building for God! Just like God's people had the assignment of building the tabernacle, you have the assignment of showing God's good heart and pointing to His kingdom. It takes every single one

of your gifts to build His kingdom. Let's pray and thank God for the special gifts He has given each of us."
