A Letter from Pastor Rudolph

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. - John 3:16-17

We know what happened in the Bible. Jesus was born, He died, and He rose again. By why? The “Gospel in a nutshell” tells us that God’s love was the root cause, but the famous verse doesn’t end there. It continues into the next verse and shows that Christ had more to His mission: *that the world might be saved through him*. This is Christ’s mission in the world: to save the world. He did not come to condemn us or cast us away from Him forever. Rather, He came to us to bring us back with Him to God in heaven. This is not a promise just for some people, but in fact for all people.

Why was Jesus conceived as a baby in Mary’s womb? To save the world. Why was He born in Bethlehem? To save the world. Why did He die on the cross? To save the world. Why did He rise from the dead? To save the world! That was His mission from the beginning, and now He sends us with that same mission into the world with the Great Commission: *Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you (Matthew 28:18-19)*.

Our mission is Christ’s mission, to bring people to God, to baptize them, and to teach them. This is the process God has chosen to use as He brings people into His Kingdom and His Family. People need to hear the Word. People need to be Baptized. And people need to hear the Word some more and be taught about God’s love. And that’s where God has called us. He has not called us to go out and condemn the world, but to go into the world and tell sinners about their Savior who died on the cross and rose from the dead in order that more people might be saved. Whether you are comfortable talking about your faith or even if it’s a challenge for you, you are a part of this mission. Jesus chose you and gave you His very Spirit to live in you and speak through you!

On Monday, August 17th at 5:00pm, we will be forming a “Missional Life Team” that will work toward implementing God’s mission into our congregational life, our mission opportunities, and our everyday conversations. Come and learn some strategies, tips, and suggestions for those moments when you have the opportunity to share your faith! In this and future meetings, we will talk about ways we can witness to visitors that come to our services, to family or friends that don’t go to church, to unbelievers, and even to friends who are already Christian. Mission work is not always about leaving Indiana. It’s about sharing the God who has loved you so much that you want other people to know about Him too!

When we talk about Mission Work, we can sometimes get too focused on ourselves: what WE are doing, who WE are helping, and where WE are going. Yet time after time, the greatest need for mission work is right next door. Maybe a better way to think about is that it’s in the next pew as interested people show up in our pews visiting us every week.

We are Friendly People, Growing in Christ; Called to: Praise and Proclaim, Learn and Love, Care and Celebrate! This is our mission statement, but it doesn’t really start with us. It starts with Jesus, because all of us have been called to share in Christ’s mission to the world.

A Letter from Pastor Rudolph...continued

As we know from John 3:16, God loved us so much that He sent His Son into the world so that we might not perish. But if you read on, the next verse goes further. Jesus did not come to condemn us or push us away. Rather, He came to save us. He came to make sure that every person in the world had a reason to live, a reason for hope, a reason for salvation. He gave that to us by dying and rising again, conquering sin, death, and hell in one swift blow. But even after Easter, His mission goes on. It continues on until the last person is saved and brought to the knowledge of the truth!

That's where we come in. We have been called to a great mission, or Great Commission: *Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you (Matthew 28:18-19)*. Our mission is not OUR mission, but HIS mission. We have been called to be witnesses in the world, both near and far.

On Monday, August 17th we will be forming a "Missional Life" team that will work to incorporate God's mission into the life of our congregation more and more every day. Our goal is not to condemn the world, but to save the world by bringing them to Christ. This team will help develop plans to best witness to our community and visitors that come through our church doors. We will also talk about strategies to incorporate faith into our everyday conversations with friends, family, and coworkers who may not know the love of Jesus.

Whether you are comfortable sharing your faith openly or whether you find it difficult to know what to say, this team will help increase your passion for and comfort with witnessing to the people that God has placed in your lives! No one is unqualified to talk about their faith. Jesus sent His Spirit into our hearts so that we don't have to worry about what we will say. He has given us His Word and set us out with a task: to Praise and Proclaim, Learn and Love, Care and Celebrate!



The call committee has met again to determine the next steps forward in the call process in light of Pastor Ahlersmeyer's declination of Peace's call for senior pastor. The congregation will once again have the opportunity to offer nominations for pastoral candidates. Nomination forms will be available at the information desk. The committee asks that all forms are returned to Grey Baals, head of the call committee, by August 16. These names will then be submitted to the district office in anticipation of a new slate of potential candidates.

Please continue to pray for God's direction and guidance in this long process, that we will be provided the shepherd that He wants here at Peace Lutheran Church.



A Note from our Board of Directors

It's that time of year when we call upon the people of Peace to step up and step into various leadership roles! Have you ever considered serving on the Board of Directors in some capacity but aren't sure what it involves? The Board of Directors meet at least six times a year, beginning in October. Meetings can be either in-person or via teleconferencing. Listed below are brief summaries of each Board

position. (NOTE: these are not complete descriptions; please contact the church office for a copy of our Constitution and By-Laws if you would like to see complete descriptions).

Chairman: Presides at all Board of Directors and Voter's Assembly meetings. Ensures all elected and selected Officers and committees are functioning and carrying out their responsibilities. Selects members to serve on the standing committees and fills any vacancies and presents these appointments to the Board of Directors.

Assistant Chairman: Presides over Board of Directors and Voters' Assembly meetings when the Chairman is absent. Chairs the Nominating and Endowment Committees. Works with pastoral staff to lead congregational development efforts, including fundraising initiatives and campaigns, endowments and other financial development programs, grant opportunity identification, and grant submission, compliance, and reporting.

Secretary: Responsible for recording all congregational minutes of the Voters' Assembly and the Board of Directors. Prepares a summary of the Board meeting minutes, which will be available to any voting member of the congregation upon request. Keeps record of attendance at all Board of Directors' meetings.

Treasurer: Responsible for maintaining records of disbursements and fund balances and submits a financial report to the Board of Directors. Ensures the proper wage and salary deductions are being made, as well as filing exemptions and property taxes. Serves as the Chairman of the annual Budget Committee.

Financial Secretary: Responsible for keeping permanent records of collections/offerings and bank deposits. Distributes the annual giving envelopes and prepares annual giving statements for members. Provides financial reports as requested by the Board of Directors.

Chairman of Elders: Acts as an assistant to the pastoral ministry and shall be concerned with the spiritual life of the congregation and directs the other Elders in the implementation of this concern. Regularly attends Board of Directors' meetings. Together with the Board of Elders and pastoral staff, he shall: supervise the visitation of newly received members and help them get involved; make every effort to induce members who have been negligent in their attendance of services; assist with Holy Communion and arranging for pulpit assistance, special services and guest preachers. He shall serve as the Chairman of the Call Committee in the event of any pastoral vacancy.

Elders: Assist with preparing and distributing communion. Attend scheduled Elder meetings. Elders do not have to attend Board of Directors' meetings.

Chairman of the Deacons: Together with the Board of Deacons, the Chairman shall be responsible appointing and supervising ushering volunteers and greeters, keep attendance for worship services, coordinate weekly acolytes, and take care of hymnals and other worship aids used in services.

Deacons: Assist in ushering, greeting, and acolyting during worship services. Attend periodic Deacon meetings. Deacons do not have to attend Board of Directors' meetings.

Chairman of Trustees: Together with the Board of Trustees, the Chairman shall administer all property of the congregation, make service contracts and transact general facility business as authorized by the Board of Directors. The Chairman shall keep a file in the church office of all equipment and appliances, regularly attend Board of Directors' meetings and advise the Board of any facility needs.

Trustees: Help maintain church and Wee Creations property and equipment. Assist Chairman of Trustees with service agreements.

Director of Fellowship: Assists in coordinating hospitality events including dinners, receptions and Sunday morning coffee hour.

Chairman of Education and Youth: Assists in the coordination of leaders in Sunday School, Bible and Confirmation classes, as needed. Acts as a liaison between leaders of the above programs and the Board of Directors.

Topics will include the books of Genesis, James, Hebrews and more!***

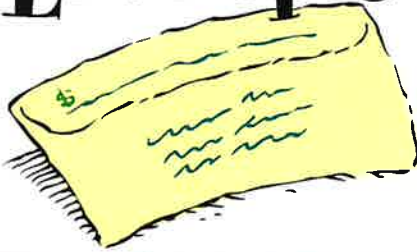

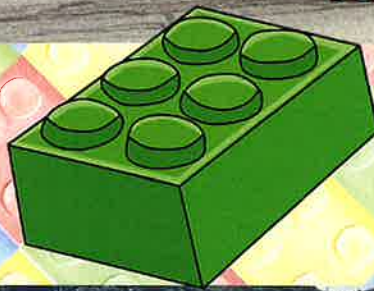

It's school time again and I look forward to being super busy adding all my school visits back into my schedule! I can hardly wait to catch up with what my school friends have been doing all summer long.

Do you know I went to school? For two whole years and then during the five years since I have to brush up on all I learned. One of my first lessons involved the command "sit". For me it means planting my rear on the floor (or the ground). No leaning on my handler or anything else. No slumping to the side. No jumping up before I'm told to move! I pay strict attention so I know exactly when to move again and what to do next. I heard that Jesus went to school, too, at the synagogue when He was a child and that He often taught while sitting with people. Do you spend time sitting with Him like Mary and Martha, the disciples, and other people did? I feel like He's sitting right there with us on our visits, sharing His love and mercy, telling us what to do next. Come sit with us and every day sit with Him!

Back to School

Mental Health Checklist

Kids spend a lot of time at school, so it's no surprise that school can have a big impact on their mental health. You can set your child up for school success by having conversations about school, working with their teachers and school staff, and finding mental health curriculums. No matter how your child feels about school, there are things you can take action on today.

- ☒ **Get back into a routine.**
About 2 weeks before school starts, gradually (15 minutes each day) move your child's bedtime and wake up time back to what they will be during the school year.
Ask: "What book do you want to read before bed?"
- ☒ **Talk to your child.**
Find a relaxed time when you can give your full attention, such as after dinner, or at some other quiet time.
Ask: "What are you excited about this school year?"
- ☒ **Review your child's expected schedule and new routine for school.**
schedule and new routine for school. Prepare for changes this school year. For example, visit a new bus stop location or new building.
Ask: "How are you feeling about changing classrooms throughout the day?"
- ☒ **Get organized.**
Have a designated place for school materials and a study area. Include a print out of the school calendar with due dates and events.
Ask: "Where can you focus to get work done outside of school?"
- ☒ **Talk about expectations-yours and your child's.**
Help your child set goals for the school year and take time to check in about their feelings for the upcoming year. Don't forget to also talk about your rules and expectations.
Ask: "What do you want to get better at this year?"
- ☒ **Connect with the school.**
Meet their teachers and school staff. Mark school events on your personal calendar so you can plan to attend. Encourage your child to join extracurriculars.
Ask: "What are some school activities you want to participate in this year?"
- ☒ **Have a last hurrah.**
Have an at-home movie night, take a family bike ride or visit a local attraction like a park, museum or zoo.
Ask: "What would be fun to do together?"
