A Letter from Pastor Rudolph

For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" (Romans 8:15)

Adoption is a beautiful representation of the Gospel. We know that everyone in the world is born in sin. We are all sinners from conception and it changes us to our core. Without grace, we constantly turn away from God and do whatever we want, regardless of whether it is right or wrong. Jesus even says that those who live in sin are "of your father the devil, and your will is to do your father's desires" (John 8:44).

That's a terrifying thought! But thanks be to God that He does not leave us in such a sorry state. Instead, the Father sent His Son to die on the cross and defeat the devil through His death and resurrection! This is the Gospel, that Jesus died for our sins and has freed us from the slavery to sin, death, and the devil that we lived in before. Now, we are free and live new lives in the Holy Spirit that God has given us through Baptism and faith.

As Paul said in Romans 8, this means that we live a new life that looks forward, not back. We didn't receive this Holy Spirit to be fearful, but to conquer fear through faith in Jesus Christ. We have instead received a "Spirit of adoption as sons" which takes us away from our ancestry of sin and brings us into the family of God, children of the Heavenly Father who loves us unconditionally.

It is this adoption that means everything to the Christian. We are no longer slaves to sin or conformed to the world. Instead, we look to Christ as our brother who died for us and saved us. We look to our new Father as a good Father who will never leave us nor forsake us. He is the Father we may never have had on earth, yet He loves us as His own and has given us His own Family name in Baptism (you've heard it: in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit).

We have been adopted into God's family to be full members of His household and to be given the full inheritance that Jesus deserved. Yet God wants us to have it. He wants us to know Him fully. He wants us to run to Him with questions, requests, and concerns. Thanks be to God that we have been saved by grace through faith and now we can know what a good Father really is: loving and compassionate.

On September 20th, we will be hosting the Flanick family to talk with us about their experience with adoption. They live and work in the Fort Wayne area and are members at Concordia Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne. Several years ago, they adopted a son and have brought him into their family and would like to share their experiences and give encouragements for anyone thinking about adoption. Come, join us on Sunday, September 20th at 9:15 (between the services) to hear more about how God works through families like the Flanicks, families like yours, and the entire adoption process to care for children in need of love, care, and support!

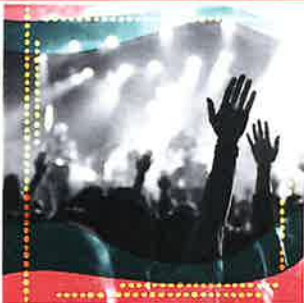

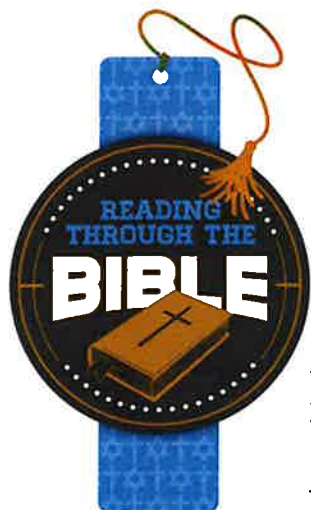

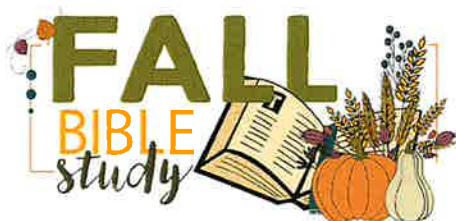
ONLINE STUDY

Topics will include the books of Genesis, James, Hebrews and more!***



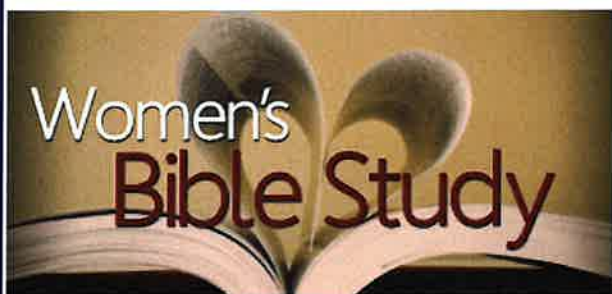
SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE CLASS

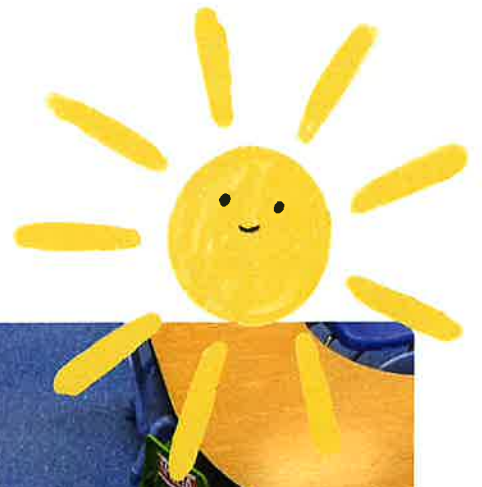
Tune in next month for thoughts about what goes on during these two hour sessions held twice a month. Of course, all of this is done within the confines of complete confidentiality.

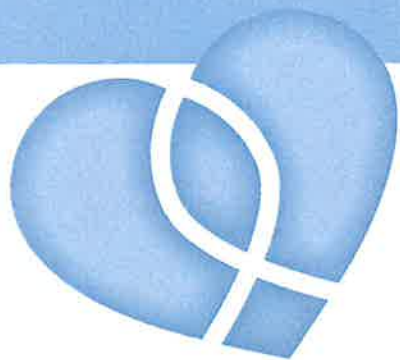

SEPTEMBER-SUICIDE PREVENTION MONTH

Preventing suicide begins long before someone is experiencing a crisis. By creating healthy environments for individuals, families, and communities, we can protect people from feeling suicidal in the first place. We can also lessen the community effects of suicides when they do happen, which can reduce risk among those who lost a loved one to suicide, and promote healing.

Everyone can help prevent suicide by learning the warning signs, promoting resilience, and supporting people at risk.

Risk factors

Someone's suicide risk varies as a result of the number and intensity of certain factors, including life circumstances and community conditions.

Some factors that may increase the likelihood of suicide can include:

- Previous suicide attempts
- History of depression and other mental illness
- Financial problems or job loss
- Bullying or social isolation
- Lack of access to health care
- Easy access to lethal means, and
- Intimate partner or family relationship problems.



Having these experiences does not predict suicide or suicide attempts. Most people who experience these factors do not attempt or die by suicide. There are also experiences and community conditions that can protect people or act as a buffer from suicide. Some of these can include:

- Coping and problem-solving skills
- Strong sense of cultural identity
- Support from friends and family
- Feeling connected to others, and
- Availability of high-quality health care.

Prevention tips

Parents and caregivers

Raising children can be challenging—**it's ok to ask for help**. Reach out to babysitters, childcare providers, family members, or close friends. Discuss your concerns with your child's doctor. Also consider finding out if your community offers support groups or programs for parents and caregivers.

- Talk to your child about their mental health and provide support for challenges they may be experiencing.
- Seek parenting skill training programs to help build stronger relationships with your children.
- Watch for signs of distress in your child like anger, withdrawal, changes in school performance, sleep, or eating, and seek help when needed.
- Build stronger relationships with your children with support from people who care about you and from your community.
- Securely store firearms and prescriptions (for example, in a gun safe or lock box) to prevent access by children and other unauthorized users.

Everyone can recognize the warning signs in their friends and family and connect them to the 24/7 Lifeline by dialing "988" or contact a mental health provider if they are in crisis.
