After Dave was finally back home, caring for his physical needs and greeting Home Health nurses was top priority; there was little time for cooking...but there was our Door Dash card! With every ring of our doorbell, we were reminded of how dear our church family is to us.

So, yes, it’s an offering to meet a need...but now I know that it is so much more...a church family reaching out in LOVE to a brother or sister!

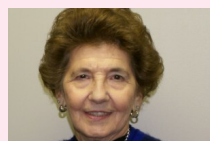
