Written by Herbert Brokering in 1964. This hymn was first published for the 90th anniversary of St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota.

Concerning the hymn, the author has said "I tried to gather into a hymn of praise the many facts of life which merge in the life of community. So there are references to building, nature, learning, family, war, festivity." Each line in the stanzas is followed by the words, "Sing to the Lord a new song!"

The Scripture reference that inspired the composer was Psalm 96: "Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord all the earth!" The entire hymn is written in Psalm like poetry. No matter what, one can sing to the Lord a new song. Whether it be the marvels of the universe or witnessing the construction of a new building. The joys of athletic and festival gatherings or the discovery of science in the labs. The Psalms regularly talk of the mountains singing and the trees clapping their hands. One can't help but see God in His marvelous creation.

Jesus, when confronted by the High Priest on Palm Sunday, used the very same image of God's creation praising Him when the priest told Him to quiet the crowds as He entered Jerusalem: ***He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent (referencing the crowd of people), the very stones would cry out."*** St. Luke 19:40

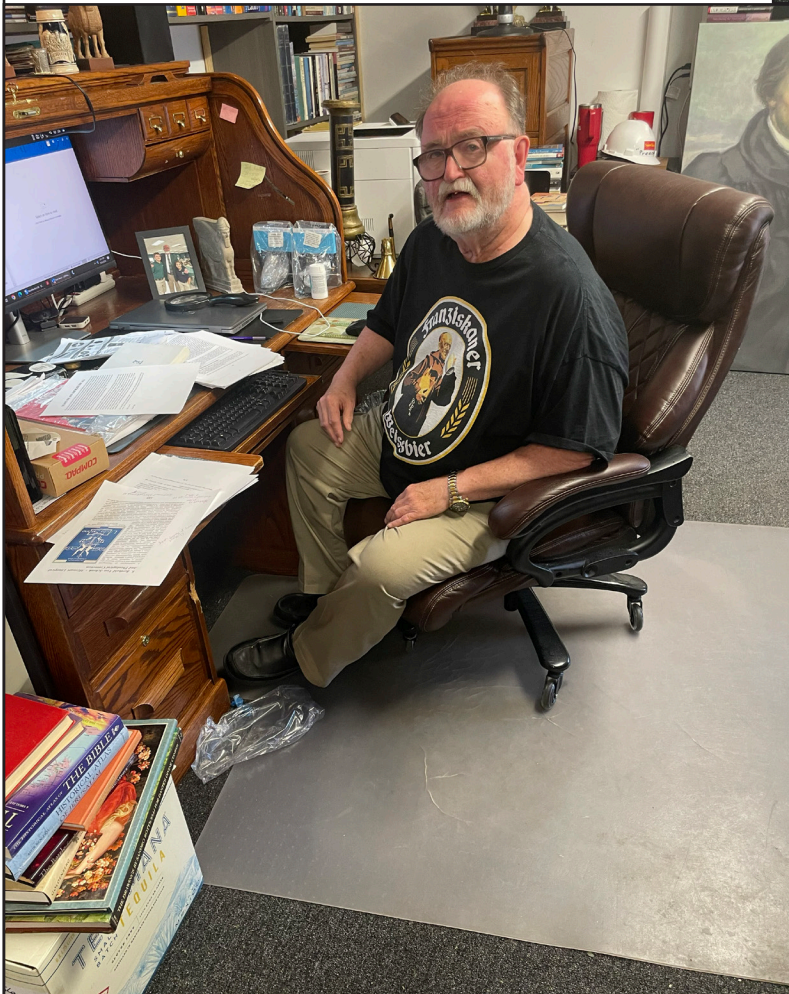

Reflections on Freedom

We just celebrated Freedom – 250 years since the Continental Congress ratified the Declaration of Independence. 56 men. 56 men who pledged “...our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.” None of the signers of the Declaration of Independence died at the hands of the British, despite one third of them having served as officers in the Militia during the war and four were actually taken captive; but nearly all were poorer at the end of the war than at the beginning. How blessed we still are, 250 years later, for their courage and sacrifice. How blessed we have been in these 250 years to have had brave men and women defend our nation’s freedom with their very lives. May God continue to bless America with men and women willing to serve our nation and defend her for generations to come.

But true freedom, liberation from the curse of sin (death – separation from God) inherited from our earthly fathers all the way back to Adam, was gained for us by Christ Jesus, God the Son. Jesus bought our freedom from sin, death and the power of the Devil on a cross at Golgotha (John 19:17-18, Matthew 27:33-35, Mark 15:22-24, Luke 23:33). The price Jesus paid for our freedom was incalculable -His very life. His life for ours. His life for mine. What amazing love!

But the choice to live in the Freedom that Christ gained for us is ours. The Apostle Paul tells us, “For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery...for you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.” (Galatians 5:1 & 13)

Through faith in Christ we are born again, truly free, and able to say “NO” to sin and “YES” to righteousness. Paul tell us, “For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his very own possession who are zealous for good works.” (Titus 2:11-14) **Further, Jesus Himself tells us, “So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.”** (John 8:36)

I urge you, brothers and sisters in Christ, to treasure our Freedom in Christ by:

- abiding in Christ and walking by faith (John 15:4, Hebrews 11:6, Hebrews 12:1-2)
- feeding on His Word daily (Matthew 4:4, 2 Timothy 3:16, John 17:17, Psalm 119:160, Psalm 119:105, Psalm 119:11)
- seeking and obeying His Word and His Will (Luke 11:28, John 14:15 & 21)
- giving Him first fruits of your time, talents and treasure (Proverbs 3:9-10, 2 Corinthians 9:7, Matthew 13:45-46)
- worshiping, praising, & thanking Him continually (Hebrews 10:1, Hebrews 12:28, Psalm 50:23, Psalm 95:2, Philippians 4:6)
- using the Spiritual Gifts He has blessed you with at OSL and every place you are (wherever you are is your mission field) (1 Corinthians 12:4-7, Hebrews 2:4, 1 Timothy 4:14, Hebrews 13:16)
- putting on the full armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-20)

May Almighty God, our Father, multiply your effectiveness and blessings as you abide in Christ and walk by faith!

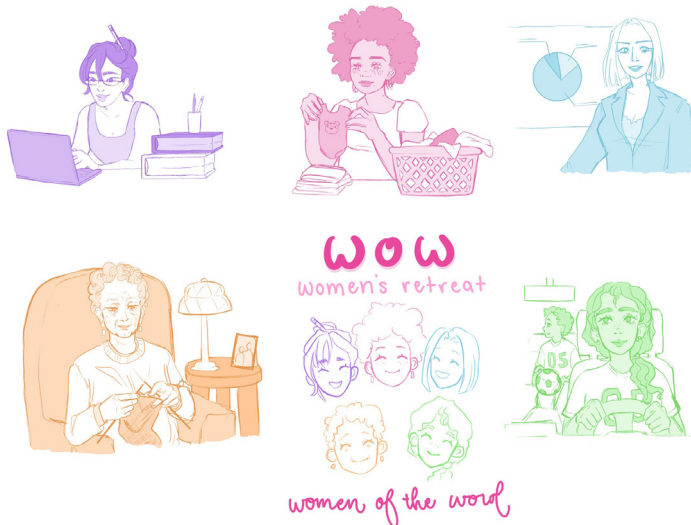

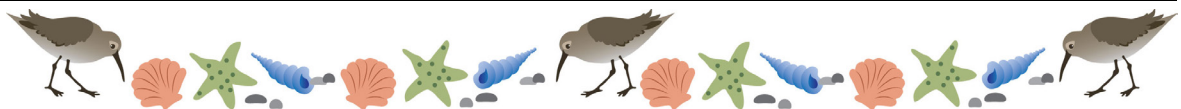
