To the members of Our Savior from the Board of Evangelism,

Greeting in the name of our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

We write with the purpose of including you in and keeping you informed about our work as of the Board of Evangelism. It has been common knowledge for some years now that most Christian church memberships are in decline. We are determined not to let OSL follow this trend. Therefore, in following the Lord's command in the Great Commission to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations," (Matthew 28:19), the Board of Evangelism is making plans to do that very thing.

Our "nations" are our neighborhoods, our city, our country, and our world; these are the mission fields to which God is calling us. To reach these "nations," we are creating mailings, articles to be placed in community newspapers, advertising, Welcome Wagon, and the like. As a jewel in the crown of the city of Houston, OSL is magnificently situated in its campus layout, its church building architecture, and its honoring of our Lord in its sanctuary design a design that boldly proclaims, "To the Glory of God and the Salvation of Man."

OSL offers vibrant confessional worship, powerful preaching, rich hymnody, and strong Christ-centered Bible studies, along with a wonderful day school and terrific fellowship. As members, we already know how great our church is. Our challenge, though, is to get this message out to our "nations." First-time visitors to our campus often say that OSL is the best-kept secret in Houston. While this may make us smile with a small spark of pride in our lovely church, we must remember that we do not want OSL to be kept a secret!

The Board of Evangelism understands that it is our responsibility to help facilitate "getting the word out," and so we are developing ways to accomplish this. However, the work of sharing the Good News of Christ is the calling of all Christians; we need you, the congregation, to be our partners in this. Seek out and greet anyone you don't know. If they are members, you will have made a new acquaintance; if they are visitors, you will be helping them to feel welcome! Make visitors feel welcome. This is such an important aspect of evangelism that the Board simply can't do alone; we need you! A visitor to a church that is never greeted, never shown where the Sunday School classes are or to whom to direct questions, will usually not want to return, and that is the last thing we want.

It is exciting to our Board when we think of visitors coming to meet us, to see and enjoy all OSL has to offer. It has been happening since OSL's conception, and we pray it will continue until the day Christ returns. People come to

faith through the power of the Word, grow in that faith and become members of the ministry of OSL, and join our church family. Church membership never stays stagnant, you are either growing or declining, so let's be determined to give our best efforts to grow and trust God to bless our efforts.





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The last of the 28 articles of the Augsburg Confession is AC XXVIII entitled "Of the Power of Bishops." The reason for including this article was twofold, first to show that there must be a distinction between the roles of the church and the state and second was to re-emphasize the true role of bishops, namely, to administer the keys given by Christ to His church on earth. It is also the longest of the twenty-eight articles.

What follows is a brief summary of this article.

Part 1 - Separation of Church and State

There is a distinction that must be made between the kingdom of the right and the kingdom of the left. Both are important and are established by God but must be kept separate because they have distinct and different roles. The power of bishops is that command given by Christ to proclaim the Gospel, to use the Office of the Keys to forgive or retain sins, and to administer the sacraments. The purpose of the church is to care for the spiritual and eternal welfare of people through the preaching and teaching of the Word of God. The purpose of the church is NOT to interfere with the affairs of government whose responsibility it is to care for the physical welfare and protection of the people. These two estates must be honored, but not mixed. The church should not involve itself in the affairs of government since they have a responsibility of its own to fulfill. When bishops do have a political office, they must remember that this role is separate from their spiritual role. The bishop's role is to "forgive sins, to judge doctrine, to reject doctrines contrary to the Gospel, and to exclude from the communion of the Church wicked people, whose wickedness is known." Bishops are to use the Word of God alone and not temporal authority. If they are true to the Word of God and follow it, the people are to be obedient to them. If the bishops teach contrary to the Word, the people should not obey.

Part 2 - The Bishop's Power to Introduce New Ceremonies

The Roman church argued for the right of bishops to introduce new ceremonies and regulations. As evidence of this power, they gave as an example the Sabbath, which they say, the church changed from Saturday to Sunday. We reject the idea that the church has the power to change the Sabbath from Saturday to Sunday. Rather, the Sabbath was abolished in the New Testament, not changed. Bishops cannot establish anything which is contrary to the Gospel. Once again it comes back to work-righteousness: "It is against Scripture to establish or require the observance of any traditions for the purpose of making satisfaction for sins, or to merit grace and righteousness." The problem with these teachings is that they are taught as a way of meriting God's grace. Scripture clearly forbids any regulation which is set up for the purpose of earning God's grace and favor. The thought that the bishops have the power to establish such practices cannot be true, otherwise, the Holy Spirit is mistaken in these many passages. Christian liberty in essence is this, "that bondage to the Law is not necessary in order to be justified." The heart of the Gospel is "we obtain grace freely by faith in Christ, and not by certain observances or acts of worship devised by people," and this teaching must be maintained! Bishops and pastors should make changes as necessary for the orderly conduct of the church, but not as a means of making satisfaction for sins. Such ordinances which are established for the sake of good order and are not made a means of earning God's grace ought to be kept by the church for the sake of love, peace, and order in the church. The error of the Roman church is that "in the Church there must be something similar to the services set forth in Leviticus, and that Christ had commissioned the apostles and bishops to come up with new ceremonies necessary to salvation." Such actions bind consciences and destroy the righteousness of faith and Christian liberty. The Lutherans ask that the bishops change their insistence on human regulations like celibacy, the sacrifice of the mass, and communion under one kind since they were introduced contrary to the custom of the church. If they will not do so, the Lutherans would be forced to follow the will of God and disobey them. The

intention of this article is to convince the bishops not to coerce people to sin by following these humanly devised ordinances for the forgiveness of sins. If the bishops refuse, they will be held accountable before God for their actions.

The church should keep to its work of preaching the Gospel for the salvation of souls, and not mettle in temporal affairs. The role of the pastor (and the church) is to lead people to the salvation won by Christ, and not invent customs by which people think they earn their own salvation, which destroys the Gospel and leads people to destruction. Lord, bless our Gospel preaching!

Dear OSL Church Family,

We had a wonderful start to the school year on August 17. We are experiencing a record enrollment of 323 as of August 23! What an amazing blessing to see what God is doing here at OSL and for our Houston community. It was 24 years ago when we experienced these kinds of numbers for enrollment.

I am certain you have noticed that the temporary buildings are placed behind the ECE buildings. Our two first grade classrooms and two of our three Kindergarten classrooms will be housed in those buildings while we await the new building which will accommodate the amazing growth God has given us over the last several years. We are awaiting the city of Houston to grant us the occupancy permit. In the meanwhile, we are housing those classes in the ancillary classrooms and library off the sports court and employing the room we used last year next to my office for a preschool room. Our teachers and families have been very flexible in this time of transition. We



are working with a permit runner and with a new parent who has dealings with the city, and both are working on our behalf to expedite this process.

We have also engaged some new processes to shore up our safety procedures at the school. We now have the Raptor program. Visitors are required to go to the office to have their driver's license scanned and a badge is provided to the visitor with the part of campus visiting listed on the badge. We are also installing magnetic locks to all exterior doors on the school buildings. A key card will be necessary to gain access to the doors. We have also installed state-of-theart security cameras in all the school buildings. Mr. Bernie Palmer, our campus security officer, is arranging a Watchdog program with our Dads and concerned males to create more campus monitoring throughout the week and school days. We are continuing to look for more ways to secure our campus for the safety of our entire community.

Mrs. Cherington will be providing a parent education class this fall. Watch for that information to join us for this valuable class.

Thank you for the wonderful support you continue to provide to make this classical Lutheran education possible for our member and community children.

Why We Pray...

It truly matters to step out of our comfort zone. Even though Roe v. Wade has been overturned, we are still needed to pray outside of abortion clinics. Planned Parenthood is offering other services, but none of these services will bring in the money that abortions did. Pro-aborts deny the science of a baby's heartbeat and their humanity, and have become angrier and more extreme. They lie over and over, "abortion is healthcare." Abortion is built on hopelessness. Planned Parenthood offers pain, suffering, sorrow and grief. Life offers love, compassion, mercy and real help.

Remember the Big Blue Bus is parked across the street. When women can't get help at Planned Parenthood, they will come to us. Women will think twice when abortion is illegal. In the past, some would use the excuse: "It's legal, so it's ok." Now they will have to travel, which can be expensive, and also take time off work. So, the baby is further developed and they will see their child better through our ultrasound on our buses. On the sidewalk, we don't just save a baby, we save generations.

No woman is so destitute that they can't be a mother or choose adoption. Pro-aborts are out of touch with the human

heart. 25% of Pro-Life people are post abortive. As an example, Sue Thayer worked 17 years for Planned Parenthood in Storm Lake, Iowa, and is now a leader in 40 Days for Life. 40 Days for Life is active in 65 countries since 2008 in College Station.

The battle is not over in the U.S. It is possible that the federal government might refuse to give Texas and other life states federal monies to build bridges, flooding help, head start programs, etc. Our work is even more important now. We are the last hope for women with unplanned pregnancies.

Why we will "win" – Time is on our side. Fr. Felix reminded us that, "connected to life is connected to Christ." Remember we have God on our side. Fight on our knees. Pray, fast, trust and believe in Jesus!

The Fall **40 Days for Life** Campaign is from Sep 28 to Nov 6, Mondays-Saturdays, outside of Planned Parenthood, Gulf Freeway, from 7am-7pm.

Please consider standing or sitting in a lawn chair outside Planned Parenthood and praying for 2 hours on Tuesday, October 4th, any time from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm. Typically, shifts are 2 hours but there is no requirement. If you can spare an hour or 30 minutes, it will be very much appreciated.

There is much power in prayer! Just look what God has done thus far! Now that He has our nation's collective attention, perhaps we can be useful in His plan to turn the hearts of the cold and apathetic to His love and care.
