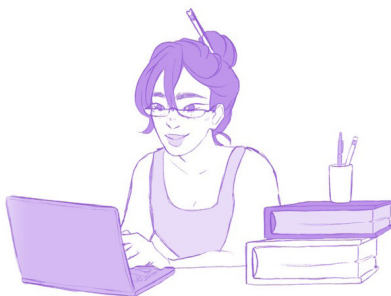

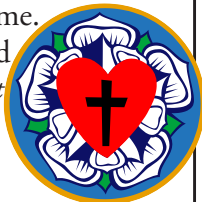

The Christian is a theologian. To be a theologian is to be someone who studies God. As the Holy Spirit comes among us, we rejoice in the good gift of his Holy Word. On August 24 we started a new **Adult Catechesis** class in the Bible Study classroom. We meet from **7PM-8:30PM**. There is a light **potluck dinner** that starts at **6:30**. This is not a class only for new members. Martin Luther used to say that he returned daily to his own Small Catechism to be assured of the gifts of Christ. You, too, are invited to join other members and interested new members in study of the Small Catechism and the Holy Scriptures. It is not too late to join us! It is in the Word of God that we grow as a family of faith. It is in study of God's Word that we learn to speak in the words of Scripture. The Lord opens our lips and fills our mouths with his praise. This class looks at the six parts of the Christian faith: the Law, the Gospel, Prayer, Holy Baptism, Confession/Absolution, and the Sacrament of the Altar. Doctrine is set by God in his Word. The things we believe have been handed down to us and preserved by the Holy Spirit. Hymn of the Month

How Firm a Foundation: LSB 728 — This hymn speaks of the power and importance of God's Holy Word and how this Word is used to build our faith.

The first stanza speaks of building the foundation of our faith, using only the Word of God. This verse reminds us that all we need in this life is contained in The Bible. The Bible brings comfort, strength and joy to the believer and reveals the awesome and loving relationship between us the Christian and our Savior.

The remaining verses are unique in that God is speaking to us in the first person, hence the quotation marks. "Fear not! I am with you." "For I am your God and will still give you aid." "I'll strengthen you...." etc.

Verse 4 reminds us that being a Christian in a sinful world will not be easy. Many temptations and persecutions will come our way. But God promises to be with us, "My grace, all sufficient, will be your supply."

Verse 5 is a comforting close to this hymn. For the Christian, this earthly life is a temporary journey. We long for the day when we will stand in the presence of our Savior. "And then, when gray hairs will their temples adorn, like lambs they will still in My bosom be borne."

May this hymn bring comfort and strength to every believer and

remind us that God is constantly protecting, guiding and loving us forever.

Lutheran Church Music

Much like most everything in the world, music in the church has evolved. The Lutheran Church is unique in that it was the first church body to incorporate congregational singing and musicians.

Prior to the Reformation, only choirs, (made mostly up from monks, nuns and priests) sang the liturgy and canticles of the church. Following the Reformation, Luther began writing hymns that taught the doctrines of the church and the congregational hymn was born. What started as a simple teaching tool grew into 100's to 1,000's of the beautiful hymns and canticles that the church has grown to love.

Each month we will look at a specific musical aspect of the church. Through a study several years ago, it was discovered that a typical Lutheran Divine Service contained 87 to 90% music of one way or another. Think about the time you spend in church each week. How much of it includes some kind of music? There are reasons for this and in this monthly article we'll discover why they exist.

Pre-Service Music: I've heard people refer to church pre-service music as "elevator music," "gathering music," "background music" and more. Pre-Service music is none of these.

The origins of church pre-service music was, at one time, a central part of worship. The music was to aid the parishioners in readying themselves for worship. Careful consideration was placed in what type of music was to be played. Most often, pre-service was in accordance with the particular season of the church, i.e. Advent, Lent, Trinity, etc. It is designed to help the congregation erase the world outside and begin to bring their focus into the house of God. A time for prayer, a time to read the Scripture lessons, perhaps even a time to read the actual text of the morning hymns without having to worry about the rhythm or melody.

Listen to the music. Ask yourself these questions:

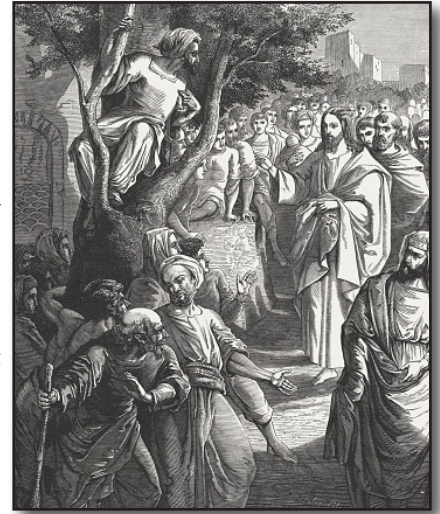
1. Is the music fast or slow or both?
2. Is the music in a pleasant key (major) or a somber key (minor)?
3. How does the melody flow?
4. What have you noticed as the church moves throughout the liturgical year? Has the style or sound of the music changed?

May the joy of music fill and prepare your hearts as we come to God and He comes to us.

Stewardship in Focus:

In Luke 19, we meet a man greatly despised as a traitor to his people, Zacchaeus, a “chief tax collector.” He wanted to see who Jesus was, so he climbed a tree along Jesus’ route, not knowing that this was a divine appointment and no “chance” encounter. Jesus stopped and looked directly at him and called him by name, “Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today.” Remember, from the Apostle John’s Gospel that Jesus said, “No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day.” (John 6:44) Zacchaeus, this notorious sinner, came to faith in Christ Jesus soon after spending time in Jesus’ presence. We know this because of the transformation of Zacchaeus’ heart (“...out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks,” (Luke 6:45)) as he, unprovoked declared, “Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold.” Jesus confirms Zacchaeus’ salvation, saying, “Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and save the lost.” (Luke 19:9-10)

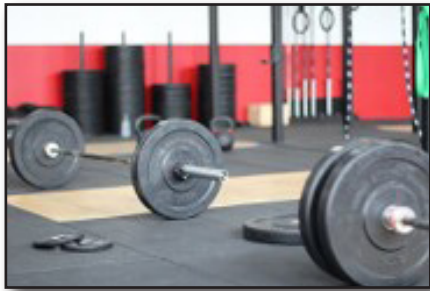


Reality Check: Am I a faithful steward of all that God has put in my charge? Am I overjoyed when I contemplate my salvation? Does my giving reflect my joy at God’s grace?

Prayer: *Lord God Almighty, help me to remember that I was redeemed at the highest cost possible -the life of your dear Son, Jesus Christ. In the joy of Your Amazing Grace showered upon me, may my heart respond like Zacchaeus, with joyful giving to You. Amen.*

Men in Focus:

The Men Alive retreat pondered this question: If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do? (Psalm 11:4) We then began a deep dive into our personal life’s foundation. What is your foundation? What are you standing on and building your “new life” upon, now that you are “saved”?

What did Jesus say about that? He had a great deal to say, as a matter of fact. See Matthew 7:24-27, and understand the perils of not building your house on “the rock.” Consider the temptation of Jesus after He was baptized (Matthew 4:1-4) and parried every thrust of the tempter. We too must recognize attacks of the evil one and be able to say, “Thus says the LORD...” and then act in obedience to God’s Word. In John 10:1-30, Jesus elaborates on His relationship to those who are His: He is our Good Shepherd and we are His sheep. He leads. We follow. “My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand.” (John 10:27-28)

The bottom line is this, as said by Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles: “For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.” (1 Corinthians 3:11)

Reality Check: What am I doing to maintain my firm footing, my foundation? Am I trying to navigate life on my own wisdom and strength? Am I feeding on the Word of God daily or merely weekly or even less often?

Prayer: *Lord God Almighty, revive my heart in Christ Jesus so that I hunger for Your Word and spend time with You, in Your Word and in prayer daily. O LORD, help me to build my house on You, the Rock, and so weather life’s storms. Amen. — Bo Guevara*

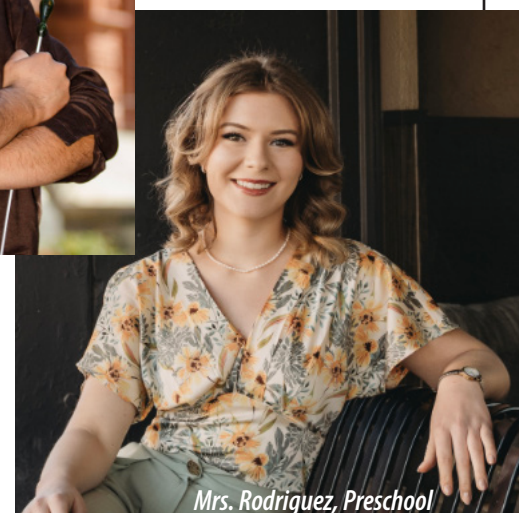
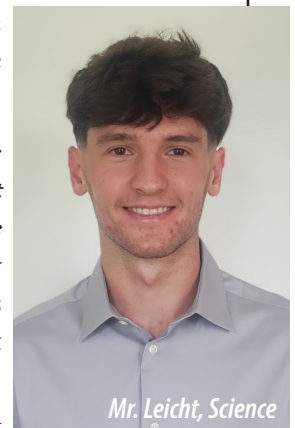
Perhaps most importantly, we spent time discussing Our Savior's vision of Excellence: what it means and what it should look like in our classrooms and throughout our school. The world often defines excellence through achievement, prestige, efficiency, and measurable outcomes. The Church has always understood excellence differently. For us, excellence begins not with performance, but with faithfulness. The foundation of excellence in a Classical Lutheran school is not ambition, but vocation. We are here because God has called us. Because He has called us, we seek to become excellent stewards of that calling. At a Classical Lutheran school, the center must always be Christ. As a faculty, we were reminded of the words of Psalm 127: "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain."

Our desire is to form our scholars in Faith, Wisdom, and Virtue. Our theme verse for this year gives us a beautiful picture of what this formation looks like. ***"Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."*** Colossians 2:6-7. The word rooted is especially meaningful for us this year. We think of Faith as the root, Wisdom as the trunk, and Virtue as the fruit that is produced. Our goal is not simply to fill our scholars' minds with information, but to help form them into faithful, wise, and virtuous young men and women who know Christ, love what is good, and are prepared to serve their neighbors faithfully. That is at the heart of a Classical Lutheran education. Education is fundamentally about the formation of the children God has entrusted to us.

There was also plenty of practical work happening around campus! Teachers prepared their classrooms, organized materials, and put the finishing touches on their plans for the year. Grades 1-5 are now settled into their permanent classrooms, and the Logic School is eagerly anticipating its move into the new building. The building is coming along nicely. Very shortly, it will have electricity and air conditioning, allowing the final painting and installations to take place.

We are grateful for your continued prayers and support of the ministry of Our Savior Lutheran School. We are excited about the year ahead and, most of all, about the opportunity God has given us to serve your children. May the Lord bless our faculty, our scholars, and our families as we begin another year together; rooted in Christ, growing in wisdom, and bearing the fruit of virtue.

Music Ministry Showcase

OSL has a vibrant music ministry encompassing many, many people of various degrees of musical knowledge and talent. God has blessed us richly with people that give their time and talent regularly throughout the year to aid in the joyous worship we share together each week.

All of our groups take a journey together. We begin with a piece of paper with notes and/or text. There is no sound, there is no music, just paper and ink.

While journeying through this “map” together, we come across those spots that remind of both beautiful mountain tops as well as valleys. Through God’s guidance and their willingness to face the challenge, the result is the praising and glorifying our God in His Sanctuary.

We have several musical opportunities that anyone can be part of. *Here is a brief description of each.*

Jubilate Choir: Jubilate means “joyful.” This is the adult mixed choir. They meet every **Thursday from 7:00-8:15pm** in the choir loft. They sing twice a month and at all Feast Days throughout the year. Anyone in high school or older is welcome to join. No prior singing or musical knowledge is necessary.

Laudate Choir: Laudate means “praise.” This is the women’s choir. They meet on the **2nd and 4th Sundays** of each month following Bible class for 30 to 45 minutes, in the choir room. They sing once a month and during the Advent and Lenten evening services. No prior singing or musical knowledge is necessary.

Carillon Ringers: A Carillon is an instrument much like an organ except instead of using air and pipes, a Carillon uses bells. The Carillon Ringers is the adult handbell choir. They meet every **Thursday from 6:15 – 7:00pm** in the choir loft. They play approximately once a month, usually at Feast Days. No musical knowledge is necessary, but helps. If you can count to six and be able to tell between your right and left hand, you can ring.

Cantate: Cantate means “sing.” Cantate is our chamber ensemble. Yes, though not a vocal group, this group “sings” through instrument. They meet on the **3rd Sunday** of each month following Bible class in the choir loft for 30 minutes. You will need your own instrument and be somewhat proficient in it, and be willing to practice on your own in between rehearsals.

Exultae: Exultae means “to rejoice.” Exultae is our brass ensemble. Through the majestic sounds of trumpets, horns, trombones and tuba, this group “rejoices” in the praises of God. They meet on the **1st Sunday** of each month in the choir loft for 30 minutes. You will need your own instrument and be somewhat proficient in it, and be willing to practice on your own in between rehearsals.

Each month we will look more closely at one of these groups. You might be surprised that much of a church’s music ministry is uniquely Lutheran and a product of the Reformation. If you’ve ever thought about being part of any of these groups, come see me. I’d be happy to walk you through and answer your questions.

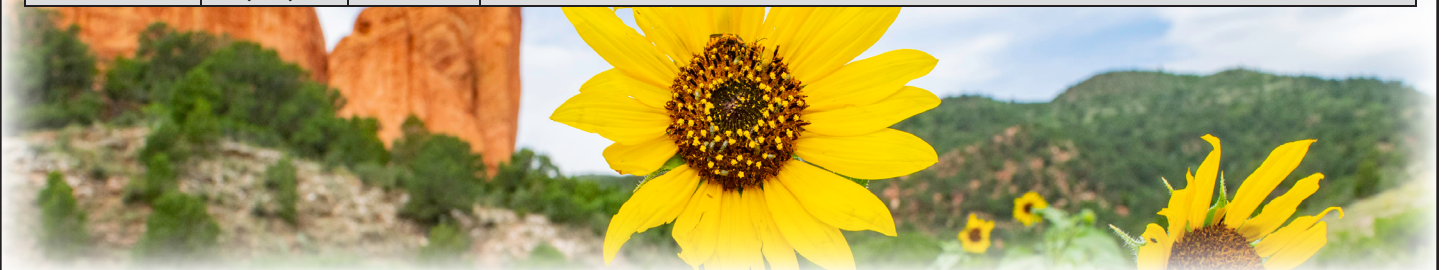
