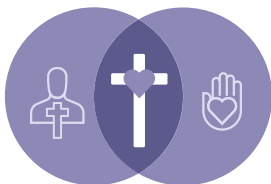

CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

God has revealed Himself to me in His Word and Sacraments and has called me His own.

CALLING: WHY AM I HERE?

I listen to God through His Word, and thank, praise, serve, and obey Him.

GROWING IN FAITH FOR LIFE

ADULT

I can express, from the text, who God is and how He desires that we approach Him.

YOUTH

I can understand that our Savior God reveals who He is through His Word.

ELEMENTARY

I understand that God is who He says He is—the one true God.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

I know God talks to me in His Word, the Bible.

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

Miraculously rescued through the waters of the Nile by Pharaoh's daughter, Moses escapes the condemnation pronounced on the other Hebrew boys. Leaving behind his life of privilege, Moses flees to Midian, where he encounters the living God in a burning bush. Through this encounter, God directs and equips Moses to rescue His chosen people from their slavery in Egypt.

TAKING IT HOME

- ▶ **On the Go**—God gave Moses gifts to help him serve the Israelites. What special gifts has God given you? How can you use your gifts to serve others and share God's Word?
- ▶ **At Mealtime**—Moses took off his sandals to honor God because He was in God's holy presence at the bush. What are some things we do to honor God in His holy house, our church?
- ▶ **Something to Do**—Use tissue paper and crayons or other craft materials to make a burning bush. Near it, write Psalm 16:11 ("In Your presence there is fullness of joy") as a reminder that God is always with you, even when He seems far away, just as He was with the Israelites in Egypt.
- ▶ **Before Bed**—God sent Aaron to help his brother, Moses, lead the people. God also sends us special helpers in our lives. Thank God for these people as you pray together.
