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
- What does Isaiah mean when he says he is a man of unclean lips? cf Luke 6:45

First

This passage describes Isaiah's calling to be a prophet to the Kingdom of Judah. It contains one of the most important passages in the Bible on the holiness and glory of God.

Discussion Points

V. 1 > Death of a King

- Why was the death of a king a time of turmoil and danger in the ancient world?
- What did Isaiah see?
- What is meant by the "train" of God's robe?
 - What was that robe really composed of?
- What did that train *fill*?

V. 2 > Seraphim

- The root of the word for "seraphim" means *to burn*. Why do you think this word is used for these creatures?
- What other angelic creatures do they seem to be like?

Vs. 3-4 > "Holy, Holy, Holy"

- What is the three-fold repetition of "Holy" meant to convey?
- What does "holy" mean?
- What are we to learn about God from the "*trishagion*" [thrice-holy]?

V. 5 > Isaiah's Response

- Have you ever wanted / hoped to see God?
 - If so, what did you think it would produce in you or solve for you?
- How does what we find here in Isaiah 6 alter that desire, if at all?
- What was Isaiah's reaction when he encountered God?
- Do you think your reaction would be different than the prophet's?

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
