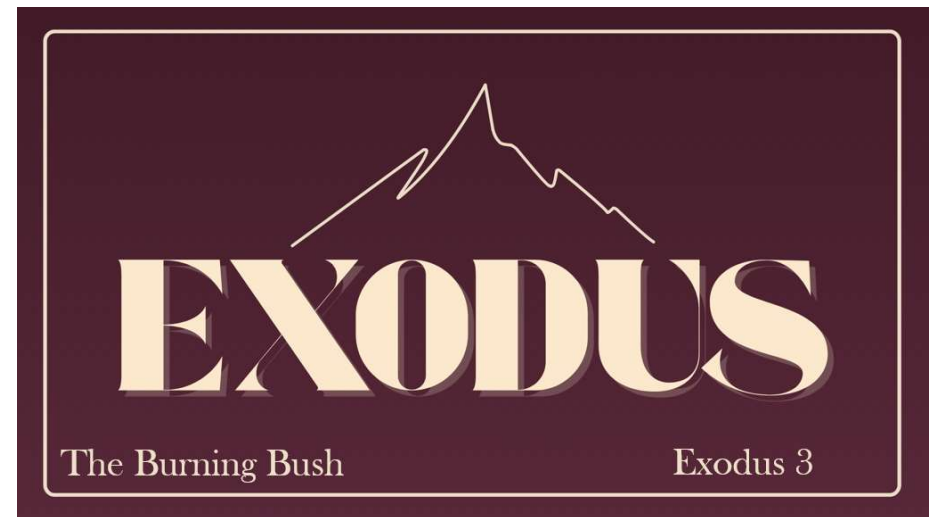


## Vs. 16-22 – God’s Specific Charge to Moses

1. How does God’s deliverance of Israel from Egypt foreshadow God’s greater deliverance through Jesus?
2. What is the significance of God identifying Himself as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob?
3. Why do you think God chooses to use Moses instead of acting alone?
4. How does having a clear sense of God’s plan and calling for our lives help us when things become challenging?
5. Are there any things God has called you to do that you are struggling with? How can you trust God this week in the midst of those struggles?

**Exodus chapter 3 begins the interaction between God and Moses as God speaks to him from the burning bush. God charges Moses with the calling of leading His people Israel out of slavery in Egypt. Moses must wrestle with his own fears of inadequacy and trust God to lead him.**

### Vs. 1 – 4 – The Angel of the LORD

---

1. What is unusual about the burning bush, and why does it capture Moses' attention?
2. What different names or titles for God are used in this passage?
3. What clues in the text suggest that the Angel of the LORD is actually God Himself?
4. How does knowing that the Angel of the LORD is actually Jesus preincarnate change the way you view this passage and others in the Old Testament?
5. How does knowing that Jesus was present and active in the Old Testament change how you view Him in the New Testament?

### Vs. 5-9 – God's Holy Presence Comes Down

---

1. What does God tell Moses to do out of reverence for His holiness?

2. In what ways do we sometimes forget that even though God is present, He is also holy?
3. How does knowing that God saw the suffering of His people and heard their cry give us hope?
4. How does knowing that God "comes down" in our suffering change the way you view your current struggles?
5. In what area(s) of your life is God's nearness needed most right now?

### Vs. 10-16 – Moses Responds to God's Calling

---

1. What are Moses' first two objections or hesitations to God's calling?
2. How does God respond to Moses' question, "Who am I?" What does this say about the importance of God's presence?
3. How does Moses' perceived, or actual weakness threaten to limit him? In what ways do you see insecurity in your own life?
4. What does God reveal about Himself in the phrase "I AM WHO I AM"?
5. How does having a clear understanding of who God is make all the difference? How does this help us step out in faith?
