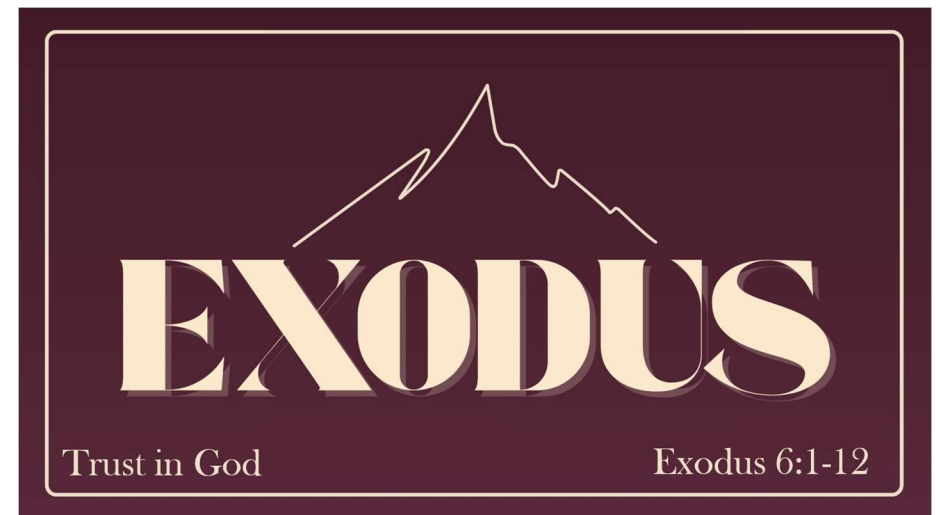


Vs. 7-8 – Trust in God Brings Intimacy with Him

1. What does it mean that God says, “I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God”? How is this like a marriage vow?
2. How is this promise from God about more than just deliverance from Egypt?
3. How does trusting God deepen your relationship with Him?

Read Exodus 6:1-13. After Moses' first encounter with Pharaoh relaying God's message that he should free the Israelites, Pharaoh made life harder for them. This caused Moses and the people of Israel to doubt and question whether they should rely on their own plans, purposes, and abilities, or God's.

Vs. 9 – Trusting in Self Brings Discouragement and Doubt

1. According to verse 9, what kept Israel from trusting God?
2. What are the "broken spirits" in our lives today — the hardships or wounds — that make trusting God feel risky?

Vs. 10-13 – Trusting in Self is Limited by Our Abilities

1. Moses fixated on his inability to speak rather than God's ability to deliver. Where do you tend to focus on your *lack* rather than God's limitless ability?
2. Do you find it easy or hard to admit weakness and limitation? How does admitting our weakness make room for God's strength?

Vs. 1 – Trust in God Depends on His Strength and Ability

1. What does God emphasize in verse 1 about *who* will deliver Israel?

2. What changes when we shift from "I can't" to "God can"?
3. Where in your life do you need to stop relying on your strength and start relying on God's?

Vs. 2-3 – Trust in God is Rooted in Who He Is

1. The name *Yahweh* — the covenant-keeping God — appears 9 times in these 13 verses. Why do you think God repeatedly emphasized His name and identity in this moment? What difference does it make to anchor our trust in *who God is* rather than in our circumstances?
2. How does knowing God's character strengthen our trust in Him?

Vs. 4-6 – Trust in God Relies on His Promises

1. Which of God's promises in this passage stands out most to you?
2. Moses forgot that God had already told him the deliverance wouldn't be easy (Exodus 3:19-20). Have you ever doubted God because things didn't happen in the timing or way you expected — only to realize later He was fulfilling His promise all along?
3. How do we respond when God's promises feel delayed?
