# Epiphany Reflections for the Year Ahead

## Revelation 21:5

*And the one who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true."*

By the time we celebrate the visit of The Magi to the Babe in Bethlehem on Epiphany (January 6), the hustle and bustle of the holidays is done in most households. It reminds us that on the 12th Day of Christmas, the season of anticipation is over. Indeed, this baby has arrived.

The story of Christmas is loud, and chaotic, and surprising, and even terrifying. And then there's Mary. She seems so steady, so calm. In Luke Chapter 2, when the shepherds show up, they are full of energy and wonder and questions. They have so much to say to this small family about what the angels proclaimed to them. And what does Mary do when she hears their story? Luke 2:19 says, ". . . and Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart."

What is it that we treasure? What is this season of Epiphany calling us to ponder in our hearts? Maybe we, too, have had a loud, and chaotic, and surprising, and even terrifying Christmas season. Even if that's not the case, the visit of The Magi serves as a hinge between the build-up of Advent, Christmas and everything that comes afterward. God has now come down to us, incarnate in the flesh of a baby.

NEXT MEETING JAN.  
25TH, 2026 AT 10:15 AM

At the Church Council’s most recent meeting, they focused on faithful stewardship, ministry planning, and caring for the life of Faith Lutheran as we begin a new year together. The conversation included financial updates, staffing transitions, long-range planning, and ways to strengthen hospitality, communication, and shared ministry.

- Reviewed financial reports showing a small surplus for November and strong early December giving; planning is underway for the 2026 budget, with a budget planning meeting scheduled for January 4.
- Discussed recent cyber fraud and phishing attempts affecting churches and plans to provide education and guidance to help protect staff and congregation members.
- Approved moving forward with hiring a new custodian beginning in January and reviewed personnel policies and staffing structures to support ministry needs.
- Continued work on hospitality and worship coordination, including welcome table staffing and Temple Talk scheduling for 2026.
- Reaffirmed commitment to long-term planning by moving toward forming a strategic growth subcommittee to help guide future ministry and outreach.
- Discussed facility care and future green space possibilities, with an emphasis on inviting congregational input before any decisions are made.
- Reviewed upcoming mission trips, congregational events, and preparations for the annual meeting in February, including ministry reports and financial statements.

Council remains committed to transparency, thoughtful planning, and working together as Faith Lutheran moves into a new year of worship, service, and community. Congregation members are encouraged to stay engaged, pray for church leadership, and participate in upcoming gatherings and conversations.

## Would You Like to Represent Faith Lutheran?

The Nominating Committee has begun putting together a ballot for the congregation to consider at the 2026 Annual Meeting.

There are two elected positions for representatives to the 2026 Synod Assembly on April 25, 2026 in Rice Lake.

There are five open positions on Church Council. The term is for two years.

In addition, many TORCH students and mentors have been actively serving during Sunday worship, continuing to grow in leadership and love for our church community.




### FLAME – Adult Education

## FLC Women Upcoming Meeting



# Finance Team Updates

## Finance Team

INTERIM CHAIR ALICIA HEINRICH

The Finance Team met on December 11 and continues to steward Faith Lutheran’s resources with care, transparency, and an eye toward the future. If you are interested in joining the team, please see Pastor Heather Brown. The next meeting is January 8<sup>th</sup>, 8:30 AM.

### Budget Planning

- The Finance Team reviewed and recommended a balanced 2026 budget to Council. An additional budget conversation is planned in January as teams continue identifying in-kind support, alternative funding sources, and stewardship opportunities.

### Thanksgiving & Special Offerings

- The Thanksgiving Offering raised \$975 for Soup or Socks, supporting food access in our community.
- The green Digital Giving Cards were well received in worship and will continue as an option for giving.

### Treasurer & Administrative Updates

- An Audit Meeting was held with new Audit Committee Members for 2026. Max Heller, Zach Hanson and Janeen Dietsche agreed to be nominated for the 2026 Audit Committee. They were voted in at the Dec. Council Meeting. The Annual Audit will take place in January.

### Role changes

- Alicia plans to transition out of her Interim Finance Team Chair role. A new chair will be needed in the new year.
- The Financial Secretary will be officially resigning at the end of December; and a new one will come on board in January.



## Treasurer’s Report

General giving for November 2025 was \$26,075, compared to \$50,243 for 2024 and \$28,594 for 2022. The year-to-date general giving was \$259,481 and is slightly higher than the general giving of \$259,242 through November 2024. The November general giving was \$4,753 lower than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. November income exceeded expenses by \$1,326. This is the first month since July that the income has exceeded expenses.

Year-to-date expenses now exceed income by \$11,369. Year-to-date income is lower than budget by \$8,119, expenses are lower than budget by \$15,442, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$2,263, resulting in net loss that is \$9,587 lower than budgeted.


