Recognizing Jesus in Our Midst: The Power of the Resurrection

"When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. 32 They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" Luke 24:30-32

Dear People of God,

The story where Jesus appears to the disciples on the road to Emmaus is one of my favorite stories about Jesus's resurrection. Those two followers of Jesus had just been through a traumatic week that culminated in Jesus's crucifixion and death. They were headed out of Jerusalem, perhaps in order to escape the horror of it all. They were probably terrified from all that they had seen and heard. But when Jesus shows up next to them, Jesus interprets for them all the events that they've experienced. And when they finally arrive at their destination, Jesus is about to leave them and continue on his journey. They ask him to stay with them, and as he shares in the breaking of the bread that evening they finally recognize that this man is their Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He's been right there with them all along.

If you were to asked why you need the resurrection, what would you say? We all know that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is central to our faith as Christians.

HISTORY OF THE STAINED GLASS WINDOWS



Faith Lutheran's "art glass" windows were designed especially for our church by the late Richard Caemmerer Jr, Professor of Art at Valparaiso University. Installed in 1970, the windows were created with rough-hewn glass edges that produce a jewel-like quality when lighted by the sun. The windows feature artwork and symbols that tell the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As the Council has met this month we are working on the goals for the 2025-26 year. I asked all the members to write down their top three goals that they felt were important to them. There was a total of ten items that were discussed.

The top three were the Parsonage Razing and how to fund it; the use of the Time and Talent sheets; and, the General Budget. Even though we had ten items on the list, we were able to address the smaller ones in an easier fashion.

How will we plan for the top 3?

#1 Parsonage: Razing and How to Fund

#2 Time and Talent Sheets:

These will be used more effectively. Our goal moving forward will be to have this information ready for the teams by Jan 1st after the Time and Talents sheets are all turned in. Then each team Chairperson will receive a list of names for their team and will be responsible for having someone from the team contact each person on the list. There will be a team binder with helpful information in it to assist that team member on how or what is to be expected when being on that team. Right now, the Coffee Hour Coordinator/Host and Welcome Team binders are complete.

Our goal is to have these binders completed by Aug 1st for all other Mission Teams. Details will come from your Council Representatives. We are making strides for our future generations.

#3 General Budget:

The Council will continue to keep a close eye on this. Kent Mueller has been doing an excellent job keeping the Council and the Congregation informed of what is going on. 



Finance Team Highlights

- We recently received \$1,438 in Thrivent Choice Dollars and an additional \$484 from our Charitable Money Market Account. If you have an account at Forward Bank you may designate Faith Lutheran Church as your Charity and they will donate funds to us.
- We are moving all 7 different accounts from Partner's Bank to Forward Bank for ease of transferring funds between accounts, including our ELCA Mission Investment Fund. We have moved FLY, Education, and Care Fund thus far.


General giving for February 2025 was \$33,780, compared to \$29,082 for 2024 and \$18,102 for 2023. The February general giving was \$9,117 more than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. Year-to-date total income is \$7,752 higher than expenses. Year-to-date total income is higher than budget by \$6,936, expenses are lower than budget by \$4,957, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$313, resulting in net income that is \$12,206 higher than budgeted.


