

BRICK BY BRICK IN 2026

Faith is the Mortar holding us together

Lenten Theme: BRICK BY BRICK IN 2026

Holy Hospitality – All are Welcome (Matt 25:35)

Our Lenten theme for 2026 will focus on the Five Bricks of Faith. Each week during Lent we will use a brick saved from the parsonage to symbolize the following foundations of our discipleship -- Holy Hospitality, Sharing Our Sacred Stories, Grateful Giving, Simply Serving, and Persistent Praying. It all starts on Ash Wednesday (Feb 18) at our 5:15pm service where we will receive ashes on our foreheads. When we hear the words “From dust you have come, and to dust you shall return,” we are also reminded that in our baptism, we have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.



Council SNIPPETS

The Council opened with reflection on Psalm 27 and the theme of light, grounding the meeting in prayer and discipleship. This theme carried through the evening as Council discussed how Faith Lutheran continues to shine Christ's light through worship, service, and community engagement.

- **Faith & Reflection:**
 - Council opened with Psalm 27, reflecting on light and our call to shine Christ's light through discipleship and service.
- **Lenten Giving (2026):**
 - Lenten offerings will be shared equally between Crossways, Lutheran Social Services, and Hammy Home. Council also celebrated strong December giving, including \$3,900 from a special appeal.
- **Lent 2026 Theme:**
 - Brick by Brick: Plans are underway focusing on Foundations of Faith, Sacred Stories, Grateful Giving, Simple Service, and Ongoing Training.
- **FLY Mission Trip Update:**
 - 18 participants (11 youth, 7 adults) are confirmed for the summer mission trip to Indianapolis. Travel plans are set, and a February escape room event is planned for team building.
- **Annual Meeting Preparation:**
 - Council finalized roles, technology support, and security plans for the February 15 Annual Meeting.
- **Communication & Online Safety:**
 - Council discussed managing Facebook comments and helping members identify legitimate church emails.
- **Building Use & Fundraising:**
 - Building use was approved for Better Way Club on Tuesdays (pending paperwork). Council also clarified a shared fundraising calendar to avoid overlap.

Jeff Johnson and Tom Loucks will be putting together a list and recommendations.

App & Communication Tools

Push notifications through the church app are now working and being tested with Faith Lutheran Youth (FLY). This will help us share timely updates and stay better connected as a church community. The team will work with Pastor Heather to host a Mission Team training for Subsplash and the App. The team will continue to promote the use of the App with the youth.

Branding, Website, and Welcome Materials

Work continues on a refreshed branding guide, website updates, and planning for new Welcome Packets in 2026. These efforts support clear, consistent communication and help us warmly welcome new and returning members. 
