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Faith Through Story: A Summer in the Parables

A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living...” (Luke 15:11b-12)

At Faith Lutheran, our confirmation students are asked to complete a certain number of “Worship Reflections” to help them deepen their understanding of our worship service. Parents are also asked to comment on the worship service and write what they learned from it. I always enjoy reading what confirmation students and their parents have to say.

All Aboard!



Financial Updates

Finance Team Highlights

FROM INTERIM CHAIR ALICIA HEINRICH

The Finance Team met in May to review financial health, policy updates, and ongoing stewardship efforts at FLC.

Below are the key highlights:

- A revised Capital Improvement Fund Policy was reviewed and approved for council recommendation.
- Insurance Renewal: Our premium increased to 6.74%, and our deductible rose from \$5,000 to \$10,000. A motion passed to add a \$750/year umbrella policy to restore previous liability coverage levels. The insurance deductible reserve will also increase to \$10,000 from reserves.
- Digital Contribution Statements: These were sent in mid-April. In the future, all financial update emails will be sent to the entire congregation, with contribution statements sent separately to include those who have not given yet.
- Money Counters Sheet: Slight adjustments were made to improve clarity, especially for memorial designations.
- Pastor attended a grant meeting with the Siebert Foundation. While capital improvement grants are unavailable, mission and growth-related funding opportunities are possible and will be explored further.

- Accounts Moving to Forward Bank Update
 - Memorial account will be moved in June.
 - Education account now includes Michele Rhodes as a signer.
- The Finance Team voted to move its regular meeting to the 2nd Thursday of each month to better align with financial processing schedules. Next Meeting: Thursday, June 12th at 8:30 AM

Treasurer's Report

FROM TREASURER KENT MUELLER

General giving for April 2025 was \$27,085, compared to \$16,891 for 2024 and \$27,843 for 2023. The April general giving was \$2,423 higher than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. April income exceeded expenses by \$4,805.

Year-to-date income exceeded expenses by \$8,075. Year-to-date income is higher than budget by \$2,054, expenses are lower than budget by \$9,505, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$686, resulting in net income that is \$12,244 higher than budgeted.


Christmas In July! July 27th

Building a Stronger Digital Presence

Part of the team will continue to work on over the summer to present a flushed out plan to the team, then to council for review.
