Summer is a good time to do something special for our worship service that kids and adults can both enjoy. During the summer of 2022, we featured THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO DR. SEUSS. In 2023, we highlighted Gary Chapman’s THE FIVE LOVE LANGUAGES. This year we are going to explore THE LION, THE WITCH & THE WARDROBE by CS Lewis.

## CS LEWIS & NARNIA

CS Lewis was a famous Christian writer who wrote THE LION, THE WITCH & THE WARDROBE for his grand-daughter, Lucy. The story begins when four children, Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy, are sent away from their home in London to escape the bombing of World War 2. The children are welcomed into the large country home of their relative, The Professor. There they discover a wardrobe that leads them into the land of Narnia. In their visits to Narnia, the children are confronted with issues of good and evil as they meet characters like the White Witch and Aslan the Lion. This summer as we join the children in their Narnia journey, there are important lessons for adults and children alike in THE LION, THE WITCH AND THE WARDROBE.

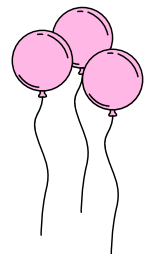

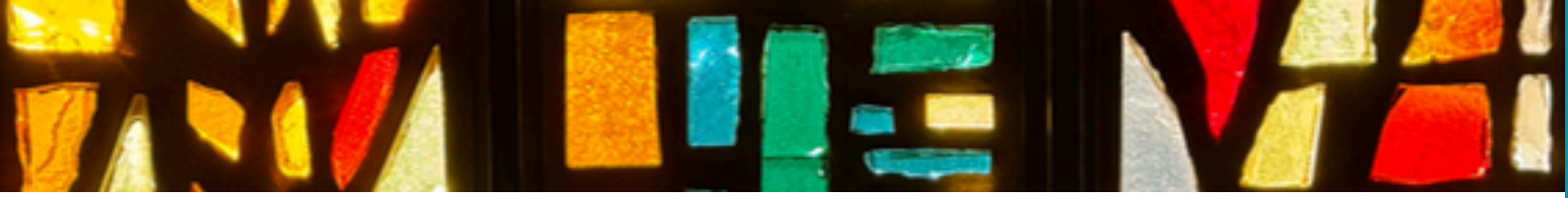

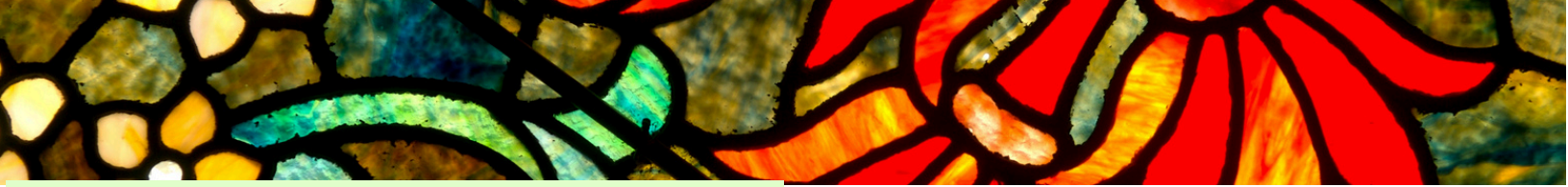
**FLY Youth Ministry Support Opportunities**

# Mission Team Updates

## Treasurer's Report

FROM TREASURER KENT MUELLER

General giving for April 2026 was \$26,780, compared to \$27,085 for 2025 and \$16,891 for 2024. The April general giving was \$1,097 higher than the budgeted amount for general giving. Income exceeded expenses by \$3,964 for April.

Year-to-date income exceeded expenses by \$16,065. Year-to-date income is higher than budget by \$6,038, expenses are lower than budget by \$6,402, and interest earnings are lower than budget by \$51, resulting in net income that is \$12,389 higher than budgeted.

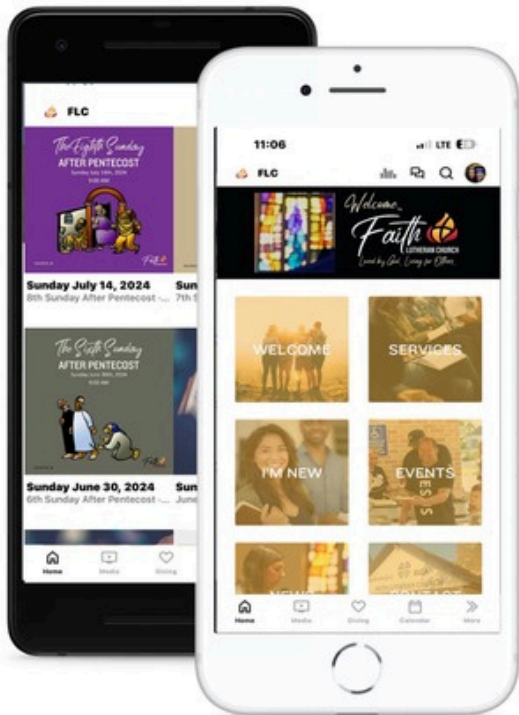
