Jesus answered [Pilate], "My kingdom is not from this world..."

Dear People of God,

As we behold the beauty of the autumn colors and give ear to the crunching leaves underfoot, we know that November is upon us. And as we enter into this final month of our church year calendar, we look forward to "Christ the King Sunday" on November 24th and pause to reflect on its meaning.

During the 1920's, churches around the world began observing Christ the King Sunday as the last Sunday in the church year. Christ the King Sunday was born out of a desire to let the whole world know that Jesus still reigned over the earth, especially after the turmoil of World War I. Throughout the "war to end all wars," people had witnessed the violent horror of earthly kingdoms in conflict with one another.

The devastation and loss of life caused by WWI was unrivaled in world history. And it was in response to such intense warfare that church leaders around the globe felt a need to say once and for all that Jesus Christ was still the one, true King of Kings.

These faithful church leaders were not proclaiming Jesus as a king who rules the world with force and an iron fist. Rather, they celebrated Jesus as one who loves the world so much that he laid down his life for it. And despite the sinful violence and destruction of this world, they announced that Jesus still desires to rule as king of peoples' hearts. Moreover, it is from the depth of human hearts that Jesus chooses to launch his kingdom.

Little Free Pantry (LFP)



Our Little Free Pantry continues to thrive and was blessed with some remodeling and a facelift. We are seeing more people benefit from the Pantry and are seeing less of the Pantry Wipeouts that occurred at all the Pantries in the city this past Summer.

The LFP is a manageable and tangible way to help address food insecurity and creates community through neighborhood engagement. It is not meant to address an on-going need, but rather to offer direct and immediate relief

The LFP may be a lifeline for those who need help with food to stretch until their next paycheck, someone unable to get to the store, or an item forgotten to buy at the store.

Focus on items you would want to receive and buy duplicates of what your household uses. No gift is too small. Just know that we are approaching a time of freezing temperatures which can be hard on some products (our Pantry is not insulated or heated).

Take what you need. If you find an item inside that you need, take it and know that we care. Please remember that the LFP belongs to all of us and take only those items needed, trusting the pantry will be here for you again


Mission Trip 2025




Christmas Choir - Join us!

Operation Christmas Tree

Operation Christmas, our tradition of donating gifts to others in our community who may not otherwise receive a Christmas gift, will be similar to last year in that we will only ask for gift cards or certificates. This year, however, there will be a tree in the Gathering Space with the gift card requests hung on the tree, and you can choose which gift card you would like to purchase. The amount is your decision. Gift cards can be returned to church on Sundays or to the office during the week. The tree will be up from December 1st to December 8th. Care Fund Update

July was one of the busiest months for the Care Fund in recent years, assisting people with urgent needs for rent, utilities, and more. We supported a variety of cases: a single mother behind on utilities, a woman unable to work due to illness, a homeless couple needing car repairs, and a family with a 16-year-old preparing for a driver's test.

In August, we helped a man seeking work certification, a woman behind on rent after medical issues, and a single mother awaiting government aid.

September saw no requests, but our partnerships with Wood County Services (FSET), the 4-H Extension Office, and the Orenda Center continue to be essential in vetting those in need. Your contributions make a difference for those in crisis. God's blessings to you all.

Treasurer's Report

General giving for September 2024 was \$24,395, compared to \$25,269 for 2023 and \$19,570 for 2022. The year-to-date general giving is \$24,346 less than the budgeted general giving. Year-to-date income is \$14,800 higher than expenses. Year-to-date total income is lower than budget by \$3,057, expenses are lower than budget by \$20,690, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$1,357, resulting in net income that is \$18,991 higher than budgeted.

This past month our Finance Team continue to review the church financials, making recommendations to council.

Here are a few highlights:

- Per the Council Presidents' requests, all Checking Accounts are to submit quarterly if not monthly reports on the incoming contributions and outgoing expenses. This coincides with the Council's responsibilities in oversight of the Financial Position for the Congregation. These accounts include the following:

 - Endowment Fund
- Sheveney Verhulst to join the Finance Team. She is a back-up for the Treasurer and is on the Endowment Board.
- Stewardship Oversight to now be part of shared responsibilities of Finance Team and Executive Council Board.

Capital Campaign Progress

FROM CHURCH COUNCIL

During the January Council Meetings, the Church Council assessed our projected building costs looking ahead for the next 5-10 years i.e. roof, parsonage and elevator were prioritized. The council decided to launch a multi-year campaign to raise funds that will go into our Capital Improvement Fund. This year the council set a goal of raising \$10,000. Mission teams are committed to launching fundraisers to help bring in funds. Here is where we are at:




