The Shape of Stewardship: Down, In, and Out

Ephesians 2:10

“For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.”

Dear People of God,

Over the years my husband, Dave, and I have been blessed to see how peoples' lives are enriched by participating in a church family. It seems that nothing can compare to the support and encouragement that comes from being part of the Body of Christ. When Dave and I came to Marshfield in 2021 so that I could interview with the Faith Lutheran Call Committee, we sensed the presence of the Holy Spirit in the church members we met. Even though the Faith Lutheran Church congregation had not worshiped inside the building for nearly a year during the COVID-19 pandemic, it was clear to us that God was still at work in peoples' lives. And that church members were still connected as Christ's body.

Four years have passed since 2021 and looking back, it is evident that the Holy Spirit is still working in and through Faith Lutheran's members. Can you believe that we welcomed 300+ participants for our Trunk-or-Treat on Sat Oct 18, 5:30-7pm? And that we were the first church in our synod to host our new Bishop, Rev Martin Halom, for a special "Dish with the Bish" event on Sun Oct 26, 4:30-7pm?



Moreover, I continue to be amazed by ministries like our Piece Corps quilting group that sewed over 800 relief quilts in 2025, in addition to assembling a variety of relief kits for those in need. And I am proud of all the volunteers from our church who help with Soup-or-Socks, providing food and other supplies to those most impacted by our country’s shifting economy.

Thanks be to God that Faith Lutheran Church continues to serve our community in unique ways at “such a time as this.” And yet, while we can be proud of all that God is doing in our midst, we also recognize that it takes an increase in resources of Time, Talent and Treasure to carry out our mission, “Loved by God – Living for Others.”

“DOWN, IN, AND OUT -- LOVING GOD AND LOVING OUR NEIGHBOR.”

Our stewardship emphasis for November invites us to look in three different directions: DOWN, IN and OUT. We are reminded that in our baptism, we are marked with the cross of Christ forever and that by God’s grace, our lives take the shape of the cross. This way of understanding stewardship can best be described as follows --


DOWN: God has come down to us by sending his son, Jesus Christ. (John 3:16).

IN: We look inward to discover all the gifts God has equipped us with and how we might serve others through them (I Cor 12:4-7).

Council SNIPPETS



Here's a snapshot of what your Church Council is working on as we plan, coordinate, and serve together. The Faith Lutheran Church Council met for its September meeting on September 29th, opening with prayer and a reflection on how our daily work serves Christ. Members shared moments of gratitude and celebrated the many people who give their time and gifts to our ministries — including the choir, the Parsonage Committee, and Janet Carlson for her faithful service with flower arrangements.

Staffing Updates

- The Council approved hiring Justin Polzin as Youth Director (10–13 hours/week) and discussed transitioning him out of his custodial duties to manage workload balance. Plans are in place for training and quarterly check-ins to support him in his first year.

Upcoming Events & Approvals

- All Saints Sunday – November 2 will include a baptism and four First Communion Students.
- Council approved the 2026 health insurance copay for Pastor Heather and adopted updates to personnel, capital improvement, and lending equipment policies.
- A Scandinavian baking event is being planned for this fall/winter.

Facility & Project Updates

- Work continues on the Parsonage project—*asbestos* removal was scheduled, and still looking to be razed in November.

Financial Update (See financial report page)

- Year-to-date expenses now exceeded income by \$12,143. Year-to-date income is lower than budget by \$12,805, expenses are lower than budget by \$12,255, and interest earnings are higher than budget by \$1,824, resulting in net loss that is \$1,273 lower than budgeted.

Other Business

- The Council reviewed financial reports, approved minutes (with clarification on the RIC discussion), and confirmed that Faith Lutheran Women and other teams will continue to submit minutes regularly. Members also discussed improvements for worship flow, communion procedures, and upcoming outreach events such as Trunk or Treat and the Christmas program.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for November 2 instead of Oct. 26th.

Website & Technology:

Faith's website updates are progressing — Education and Finance pages are nearly complete, with Youth pages in the works. The team also approved a new Youth Ministry computer and a docking station for Pastor Heather, both within budget. Microsoft 365 accounts were reviewed to ensure each ministry area has the tools it needs.

Livestream Ministry:

Our livestream continues to be a vital outreach for those worshiping from home or while traveling. The team reviewed summer viewing metrics, discussed ways to boost engagement, and is exploring new streaming hardware to improve quality. Special thanks to longtime member Marion Rasmussen (age 97!) for her helpful feedback — we love that our livestream reaches every generation! (Cable viewers will soon see services start 10 minutes in.)

Looking Ahead:

The team began shaping a Five-Year Digital Ministry Plan to guide Faith's growing online presence. This includes exploring a part-time Digital Communications Director role to manage content and connect with digital participants. Further discussion will continue at our next meeting.

Parsonage Updates

- Marty Yohn, John Lenz, Renee Stafford and Kent Mueller removed the copper pipe in the parsonage basement. We received a check for \$797.33 for the scrap metal from the parsonage. A check for \$768.14 was from copper. Thanks to John Lenz for letting me know about 1st Choice Recycling in Spencer!
- Renee Stafford, Kent Mueller, and Marty Yohn finished removing all the landscaping blocks this morning. Each block weighed 40#. They left the sub-row of blocks as a blacktop edge protection during demolition.
- Marshfield Utilities removed the electric meter and electric service. WE Energies removed the gas meter last week. They also cut the gas service off in the terrace across the street.
- Kent Mueller put up one exterior solar light above the garage service door. Kent Mueller I will install the solar light and solar panel for the interior of the garage, and get another solar light to mount above the garage doors.
- Asbestos was completed.

- Black top was completed on the street in front of the parsonage
- The water meter was removed. Gas meter is removed and they have stopped billing us
- Habitat for Humanity has removed kitchen cabinets, inside/outside doors, windows, frames and some light fixtures.

Next step is to remove gas tank then tear it down. Sometime the first part of November.

Treasurer's Report

General giving for September 2025 was \$20,435, compared to \$24,395 for 2024 and \$25,269 for 2023, and was lower than the general giving in the months of June, July, and August. The year-to-date general giving was \$205,718, compared to \$190,154 through September 2024. The September general giving was \$4,227 lower than the breakeven point for general giving. The breakeven point is the amount needed to have a balanced budget for the year. September expenses exceeded income by \$1,964.




