## 2026-2027 Homeschool Program Sample Schedule

### **A Note about the Sample Schedule:**

Every month, your student will participate in three Adventures, covering three out of four curriculum categories: Nature and Science, Outdoor Skills, Challenges, and Creative Design. Age, group size, and time available can alter the month-to-month schedule for the time students spend on an activity. Groups are created with children of the same age to ensure age-appropriate fun and learning.

### **8:45-9:00 am Drop-Off**

Parents are asked to remain in their vehicles during the drop-off/pick-up procedure, which takes place in our Circle Drive. The Circle Drive should be accessed from streets east of Camp Roger—e.g., Pottowatomie, Naontah, Echo, Cardinal. Most people will likely enter from Belding Road by turning south on Pottowatomie Trail (just east of Bostwick Lake Bakery). Pottowatomie Trail dead-ends at the top of the hill; turn right into Camp Roger over the next hill. Follow the Circle Drive around to the right to drop off and pick up.

If Camp Roger staff members are not present, please have your child wait in the vehicle until a staff member arrives. If you arrive after 9:15 am, please park your car in the visitor lot and walk with your child to the Welcome Center. Staff will ensure your child can connect with the right Camp Roger educator and join their group.

### **9:35 am Adventure #1 - Nature and Science, Outdoor Skills, Challenges, or Creative Design**

No weather is bad weather; it's just weather you need to be prepared for! All our programming takes place in the great outdoors of Camp Roger, so pack gear for the day ahead for your student (raincoat, boots, hat, gloves, warm coat, etc.).

### **10:45 am Snack Break**

We do not provide snacks or lunches for students. Snacks and meals will need to come from home. Snack time is a great chance for siblings and friends to play and chat, to refresh our bodies, and to take a break from the elements.

Occasionally, as part of the curriculum and camp experience, camp staff offer optional food and drink items, e.g., marshmallows, hot chocolate, and other campfire foods. We ask that students with dietary restrictions abstain from these items when necessary.

Please discuss any concerns you may have with a Camp Roger instructor before participating.

**11:00 am**      **Adventure #2 - Nature and Science, Outdoor Skills, Challenges, or Creative Design**

**12:10 pm**      **Lunchtime!**

Students will have time to eat their sack lunches with their peers. There will be no microwave or refrigerator available - please plan accordingly. If you forget lunch at home, it's okay! You can drop off the original lunch at the Welcome Center or purchase one for your child at Bostwick Lake Bakery (right next to Pottawatomie Drive) or at Ric's Market (at the intersection of Belding Road and Meyers Lake Road).

**12:40 pm**      **Adventure #3 - Nature and Science, Outdoor Skills, Challenges, or Creative Design**

**1:50 pm**      **Return to the Classroom**

Students will pack up their belongings to prepare to head home. We will spend a few minutes debriefing the activities we did throughout the day and say a quick prayer before we meet again next month!

**2:00 pm**      **Pick-up**

Pick-up will follow the same pattern as the morning drop-off. Students will walk behind the fence of our volleyball court and wait for instructions from the Camp Roger staff. Please be patient during the pick-up period, as we are doing our best to keep students safe and the process running smoothly.
