Milestones

We celebrated being 88 years strong and continued to develop our ONLINE studio to reach our community and world for Jesus and we are sending a mission team to Turkey.

Salvations

Preaching

Disciple making

We saw our Four Chair Disciple making strategy upgraded and began to see our Enrichment classes on Wednesday nights help grow and mature believers. We saw 79 people attend these classes in person.

Mentorship

We have seen a few men and women and couples intentionally mentored as relational disciple making has continued.

Post COVID Response

We Live streamed every service gathering during 2022. All our Sunday Gatherings were in person. Having both online and in person gatherings has been a benefit for our church family.

Finances



Our Merge Group Director is hard at work with information that will be available soon. We have 12 Merge groups that meet on a regular basis.

Growth.

OPS BOARD

2022-2023 has seen a climb back into normal functions for the Ops and Admin board. The building has returned to most of its regular use. The board has been a consistent group throughout this year. In addition to a consistent leadership group, we have also seen many volunteers contribute their gifts in helping maintain the building. The gym roof has been repaired and we have received donations to help with the cost. We have also had a handful of successful fundraisers, with more to come. Thank you to our volunteers' willingness to use their skills and talents to help.

Financially, we still have been careful with what God has provided. As building functions increase so do expenses. While some long-term rentals have fully returned, others were unable to. We responsibly continued with a conservative budget that was put in place the previous year, and God has provided what was needed to cover our minimum expenses and essential repairs (with continued ingenuity to save on expenses required).

We still hope to rebuild our capital fund, something that was not possible this last year, and replace the renters who have not returned. Future planned repairs to the building include:

Paying back the gym roof repair Repairing the roof over the café Replacing the 20+ year old boiler Replacing furnaces as necessary

This year, we have begun to see growth again in our Young Adults group. We were able to have a number of events throughout the year, and have now begun to meet weekly on Tuesday Nights for a time of worship & faith development.

YOUTH DROP-IN

With combining our Jr & Sr Youth in January, we have continued to open our doors on Thursday Nights for a Sr Youth Drop-in for youth in Grades 8-12. It's been great to see students take this opportunity to connect together, worship together & pray together!

MISSION TEAM

Theme for 2023 - 2024 "Love Türkiye"

Bible verse: The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promises as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. 2 Peter 3:9

The Good News Team (GNT) is striving to share our passion for missions. Our hope is that Calvary Church will continue to see the importance of mission work in the world. During 2022 our Mission Sunday focus was "A Third Of Us". We were blessed by the messages shared by Marty Frisk, Craig Danielson, Andrew McGrath and Moshen Hasanipoor. The focus of their messages was the great commission Jesus gave to His followers.

Reflecting back on our Mission theme in 2022, "A Third Of Us" based on the book from Marvin Newell. A Third of the world does not have access to the Gospel. The Good News Team attempted to present a clear view of the present situation in the world. One out of every three people in the world is unreached for Christ. There is an unfinished task that Christians are continually faced with, sharing the gospel with the world. A third of the world has no opportunity to believe because they have no access to the good news of Jesus. Essentially, they have No Bible, No Believers, and No Church. They are called the Unreached, the Least-reached, or the Frontier peoples. The problem is that many of the unreached people of the world are not easily reached due to restrictions such as geographic location, political environment, language barriers and financial resources.

We believe the next step in our journey of obeying the great commission of Jesus has led us to our theme for 2023 "Love Türkiye". The country of Türkiye is one of the least reached people groups of the world. Our goals for 2023 - 2024 include investigating how we can share the gospel with the unreached people of Türkiye. To facilitate this goal, Calvary Church is sending a team to Türkiye to listen and learn from Christian leaders there. Marty Frisk will be leading a team in May 2023 to Türkiye including Roger and Olga Bronn, Tanya Kostenyuk and Zareh Zetlian from the Peoples Church in Toronto. We want to learn what we can do to support the growing number of believers in Türkiye.

Our Calvary Church missionaries have continued to serve our Lord faithfully. I will endeavor to provide a few missionary highlights in my report. For more in depth information with specific details that will allow you to pray effectively, consider signing up for email newsletters.

David and Sue Schmidt spend a good portion of 2022 back in Canada and the United States completing training requirements. In the fall, Sue taught a seminar course at Heritage Seminary in Cambridge. They returned to Israel in mid January 2023. Their work with Israeli congregations continues. David is preaching in their different congregations. Both David and Sue are teaching courses and providing valuable leadership training for believers in Israel.

Mark and Janet Case continue to serve the Lord in Paraguay. Their leadership skills are being used to help plan and assess work with Bible translation projects and Church plants in different tribal areas. Please pray for the training and mobilizing of new missionaries and the planting and development of tribal churches.

Marty and Becky Frisk are passionate followers of Jesus serving the Lord with Christar. Their ministry work allows them the flexibility to work from their home here in St. Catharines. Calvary Church really gets to benefit from their willingness to teach and serve. In the fall, Becky taught a Wednesday night live course on "Resolving Everyday Conflict". Marty's preaching and teaching (including summer bible camp) has helped us all to be mission minded. Marty is taking two teams to Turkey in April and May this year. He has a tremendous passion for the unreached people of Turkey to see Jesus. Marty has used his Mongolian yurt to draw attention to the need of the gospel among unreached people groups in the world. To learn more about their ministry work, talk to them.

MISSONS TEAM CONT'D

Javed and Roya Javed are diligently serving the Lord with Pamir ministries. Their internet and radio studio presents both live and pre recorded messages broadcasted into Afghanistan every day. Listener inquiries are responded to by Javed and Roya and other team members. Javed and Roya visited Calvary Church in November 2022 for a Wednesday night Encounter session. It was a blessing and a challenge to hear how God is at work in Afghanistan. Their hope is to move to Turkey to continue their ministry work of sharing Jesus with the unreached people of Afghanistan.

Moshen and Mina Hasanipoor visited Canada for several months in 2022. Moshen preached at Calvary Church in July, sharing Jesus' teaching on the great commission from the Word of God. They shared their challenges in reaching refugees and travelers coming to Turkey from Iran and other countries. The Good News Team was blessed to meet with them for lunch and share some time fellowshipping with them and praying with them. They invited us to come and visit them in Turkey.

Brian and Carol Ann Lawrence meet with the Good News Team in March for dinner and fellowship. We learned more about their ministry work with Kurdish people in the Hamilton region. We also met with Kudish refugees, Kohzan and his wife Lajan. Kohzan and his family came to Canada a little over three years ago. They had suffered much persecution for their faith in Jesus prior to coming to Canada.

Brian and Carol Ann also have other ministry responsibilities with Christar in North America. They are organizing a Christar Affinity conference for ministry workers in July 2023 in New Jersey.

Derek and Ann-Marie Johnson are a vital part of the member care team working at the Christar office. Derek is actively supporting the missionaries of Christar around the world from his office right here at Calvary Church. Derek is working full time with Christar. Derek and Ann-Marie are anticipating going to the Philippines in July 2023 to spend time with the Lewis family (Christar workers). Their short term ministry project is expected to be very busy. Ann-Marie will be providing special education training for teachers at a Christian school, where the Lewis's five children attend. She will be providing guidance with the development and implementation of individual education plans for students with exceptionalities. Derek will be providing training sessions on topics such as conflict resolution. Consider being a prayer Partner in 2023!

Lynn Middleton continues to be responsible for financial matters on the Christar member care team. Christar workers are depending on Lynn to make sure their financial support is handled in a timely manner. Thank you Lynn for using your training and expertise for the Lord's work with Christar!

Rev. Charles Henri Cote has been asked to help start a new church in Rockland, Ontario (near Ottawa). This French speaking community is very close to the Quebec border. Charles has decided to slow down a bit but is still working diligently for the Lord.

Joshua Narjinary and his mother, Puspa continue to serve the Lord faithfully in North Bengal India with Partners International.

The Good News Team continues to use our special offerings to provide support for local missions work and top up the McLean fund for special mission projects. Calvary Church has been able to support local ministries; Niagara Life Centre, Youth Unlimited, Migrant Workers, Agora Ministries, Niagara Falls Christian Ministries food bank, and Out of the Cold ministry. Through the McLean fund we have provided support to David and Sue Schmidt to cover medical expenses, Marty Frisk for a trailer to transport and store the yurt and supplies. Turkey team members to help cover trip costs, and Ann-Marie Johnson trip expenses traveling to the Philippines.
