

5-Day Devotional: The Evidence of Resurrection

04/06-10/26

Day 1: The Evidence of His Innocence

Reading: 1 Peter 1:18-19; Hebrews 4:15

Devotional: Jesus stood under intense scrutiny—examined by religious leaders, public opinion, and even His betrayer—yet no fault was found in Him. He was the spotless Lamb of God, without blemish or sin. This wasn't about His performance; it was about His perfect nature. Today, reflect on this truth: He took your blemishes and gave you His perfection. You cannot earn righteousness through religious activity or moral striving. His complete perfection has covered your imperfection. When God looks at you through the blood of Jesus, He sees you as spotless, blameless, and holy. Let this truth settle deep in your soul today—you are made righteous not by what you do, but by what He has done.

Reflection Question: What blemishes are you trying to hide or fix on your own that you need to surrender to Jesus?

Day 2: The Evidence of His Love

Reading: Romans 5:8; John 3:16

Devotional: The cross screams one message: you are worth saving. While you were still a sinner—still broken, still making your mess worse—Christ died for you. He didn't wait for you to clean up, get better, or prove your worth. He loved you as a rebel, as an enemy, as someone far from Him. The evidence of His love is not found in your goodness but in His sacrifice. Jesus could have called legions of angels to rescue Him from the cross, but He stayed there because He thought you were worth it. His mission was you. Today, let the weight of that love transform how you see yourself. You have value because He set His love on you.

Reflection Question: In what areas of your life do you struggle to believe you're worth saving?

Day 3: The Power of the Blood

Reading: Hebrews 9:11-14; Revelation 1:5-6

Devotional: There is supernatural power in the blood of Jesus. It's not about your performance, perfection, or striving for acceptance—it's only by the blood. The blood cleanses you from the inside out, washing away every stain, every shame, every failure. It makes you holy, righteous, purified, and spotless. It justifies you—making you just as if you'd never sinned. This isn't temporary or conditional; it's a complete transformation. The blood doesn't just cover your sin; it removes it entirely. Today, stand in the reality that you have been washed in the blood. You are not defined by your past but by the power of what Jesus accomplished at Calvary.

Reflection Question: What shame or guilt are you still carrying that the blood of Jesus has already washed away?

Day 4: From Survivor to Testifier

Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17; Revelation 12:11

Devotional: Resurrection changes your identity. You are not merely a survivor of your trauma, addiction, failure, or pain—you are a testifier of God's delivering power. The disciples moved from hiding in fear to boldly proclaiming the risen Christ. They didn't just talk about what they survived; they testified about what God had done. You have a living testimony. You once were lost, but now you're found. You once were bound, but now you're free. You once carried shame, but now you walk in victory. Stop identifying yourself by what you went through and start declaring what God brought you out of. Your testimony is evidence that resurrection power is real and available today.

Reflection Question: What testimony of God's power in your life do you need to start declaring instead of just surviving?

Day 5: Peace in the Room

Reading: John 20:19-23; Philippians 4:6-7

Devotional: When Jesus entered the room where the disciples were hiding in fear, He spoke one word: "Peace." This wasn't just a greeting; it was a declaration of wholeness, completeness, and divine order. Jesus doesn't stand at the edge of your chaos and shout instructions—He walks into the center of your mess and brings peace. Whatever room you find yourself shut in today—fear, disappointment, grief, confusion—Jesus is present. He comes not to condemn but to restore. His resurrection means that no grave can hold you down, no fear can paralyze you, and no failure is final. There is more ahead. God is still writing your story. Receive His peace today—the kind that surpasses understanding and guards your heart.

Reflection Question: What fearful place in your life do you need to invite Jesus into today to receive His peace?

Closing Prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You for the evidence of Your innocence, Your love, and Your resurrection power. Help me to walk not as a survivor but as a testifier of what You have done. Wash me clean by Your blood, give me Your peace, and transform my identity from broken to whole. I declare that because You walked out of the grave, I can walk out of every tomb that has held me captive. In Jesus' name, Amen.
