No Other Name | The Good Shepherd

DINNER & DELIGHT *45 minutes*

- During dinner, share about someone you naturally trust to guide you. What makes them trustworthy?

LEARN & STUDY *20 minutes*

Read together: *John 10v11-18*

- What repeated phrases or images do you observe in this passage? What's significant about this repetition?
- How does Jesus describe himself in verses 11 and 14? Reflecting on the passage and Nate's message, what does the good shepherd do?
- What contrast does Jesus make between the shepherd and the hired hand? Why is this contrast important?

PRACTICE & IMPLEMENT *40 minutes*

RIGHT NOW:

- Who or what do you look to in times of trouble?
- Jesus is the good shepherd—meaning he personally knows and cares for his sheep and sacrificially leads and guards his sheep.
 - How have you experienced Jesus know and care for you? How have you experienced him sacrificially lead and guard you?
 - What needs to change in your life for you to keep your focus on the good shepherd?
- Nate led us to look to the good shepherd by corporately reading Psalm 23.
 - As a community, read Psalm 23 aloud two verses at a time. After each section, pause for two minutes and invite people to pray out loud. Continue this rhythm until all six verses are read.

THIS WEEK:

- Reflect: How did I experience the good shepherd today?
- Recenter your heart on the good shepherd by prayerfully reading Psalm 23 out loud.

REFLECT & PRAY *15 minutes*

- What is one takeaway from your time in community today?
- Make **3 invitations** to Easter gatherings this weekend!!
