



1. What did you know about the book of Obadiah before today, and what surprised you most about it?
2. Obadiah describes Edom as trusting in their geography, their alliances, and their own wisdom. Which of those three do people today tend to trust in most?
3. Edom's pride is described as presumption, acting as though they were above accountability. Where do you see that kind of pride operating in our culture today?
4. The relationship between Israel and Edom goes all the way back to Jacob and Esau. How does the fact that they were family make Edom's behavior worse rather than just different?
5. Obadiah 21 declares that the kingdom will belong to the LORD. What does it mean to you personally that the kingdom belongs to God and not to any nation, institution, or power?
6. Israel overheard a message not directed at them and found hope in it. Has there been a moment in your life when something God was doing elsewhere renewed your faith? What was that like?
7. The Big Idea of this sermon is that God's justice is never late, and when it comes it brings salvation with it. Where in your life do you most need to trust that promise today?
