



1. **Read Habakkuk 1:1-4.** Habakkuk's repeated cry, "How long, O Lord?" reveals both deep frustration and persistent faith.
 - a. What prayer have you carried for a long time, and how has the waiting affected your trust in God?
2. **Read Habakkuk 1:5-13.** God answers Judah's injustice by raising up Babylon—an answer Habakkuk finds even more troubling than the original problem.
 - a. When has God worked in a way you did not understand or would not have chosen?
 - b. How did you respond?
3. **Read Habakkuk 2:1-4.**
 - a. What does it mean that "the righteous shall live by his faith"?
 - b. How is trusting God different from merely believing true things about Him?
4. **Read Habakkuk 3:16-19.** Habakkuk describes complete loss and still declares, "Yet I will rejoice in the Lord."
 - a. What circumstances make worship difficult for you right now? What might it look like to rejoice in God before those circumstances change?
5. **Read Luke 22:39-44.** Jesus asks for the cup to be taken from Him, yet submits to the Father's will.
 - b. How does Jesus' obedience in the garden deepen your understanding of what it means to trust God when you do not understand His plan?
