

5 Day Devotional: "Cracking the Code - Live to Grow"

The Power of First Impressions

Embarking on a journey of spiritual growth is a deliberate and transformative process. The Apostle Paul, in Colossians 2:6–7, urges believers to "walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith." This passage serves as a foundation for understanding the intentional nature of spiritual growth.

Day 1: The Christ You Received

Scripture Reading: Colossians 2:6–7, Colossians 1:15–20, John 1:12–13, Romans 10:9–10

Reflect on the significance of receiving Christ Jesus as Lord. This isn't merely about accepting ideas about Jesus but embracing Him as the Savior, Lord, and the fullness of God revealed. Consider how this foundational step influences your spiritual journey.

Reflection Questions:

1. Have you received the real Christ of Scripture, or just a version of Jesus that feels comfortable to you?

3. Why is it so important to remember that Christianity begins with Christ, not with us?

Practical Application: Take five minutes today and thank God specifically for who Christ is: your Savior, Lord, righteousness, peace, and hope. Don't rush it. Slow down and name the mercies that are yours in Him.

Day 2: Rooted in Christ

Scripture Reading: Colossians 2:6–7, Ephesians 3:17, Psalm 1:1–3

Being rooted in Christ signifies establishing a strong foundation in faith. Just as a tree's stability depends on its roots, our spiritual stability relies on our connection to Jesus. Reflect on how deepening your relationship with Christ can lead to spiritual growth.

Reflection Questions:

1. What practices help you deepen your relationship with Christ?
2. How does being rooted in Christ influence your daily decisions?
3. In what areas of your life do you need to strengthen your roots in Christ?

Practical Application: Dedicate time today to engage in a spiritual discipline that strengthens your roots in Christ, such as reading Scripture, prayer, or meditation.

Scripture Reading: Colossians 2:6–7, Galatians 5:16, 1 John 2:6
