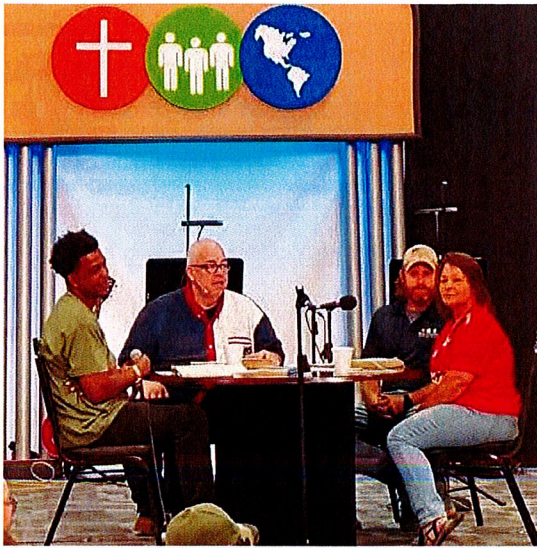
What's New!

In June we wrapped up our final night of Discipleship Training at Okolona Christian Church, and what an incredible journey it has been!

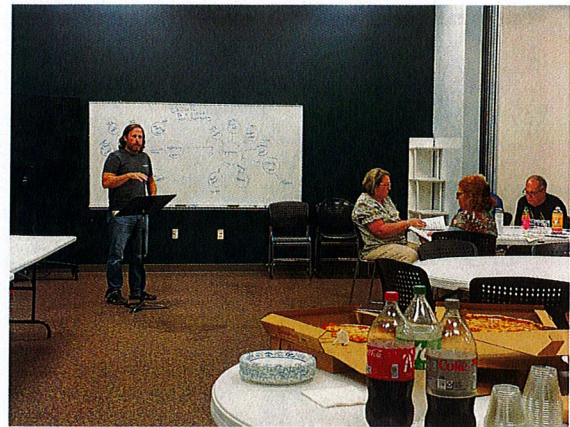
As we concluded our time together, the students made a personal commitment to begin praying intentionally, shepherding others, and making disciples who make

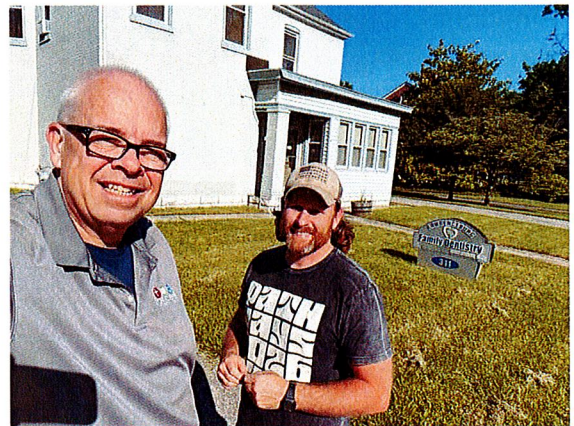
