Why are we doing Great Adventure?

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians he addresses multiple problems in the church that he says are all resulting from a lack of gospel orientation in their hearts. He is saying, because the resurrection is true, our lives should take on the shape of the cross as well. The cross declares the heart of God for the world is one of unselfish and compassionate love willing to bear weight on our behalf and for our benefit. Therefore, if we are so caught in up the beauty and glory of Jesus we will want to be caught up in whatever He is doing and whatever He wants for us as individuals and a church family .

For SWBC, Great Adventure is our church's way of walking into the cross-shaped way of living. It requires a lot of organization, a lot of team work, and a lot of volunteer contribution on top of the ways we may already be serving. When we serve, we are serving Jesus' bride (the church). Great adventure is our way of serving those Jesus has invited into his family but have not come.

What is [Great Adventure?](#)

Great Adventure is a community outreach initiative we launch during the month of June as a church family. Our students are intentionally trained in teaching and evangelism as we propel them into opportunities to lead teams and groups to share the gospel with kids in our community.

We need everyone in our church body to be involved – whether it's hosting a kids club on your lawn, driving students to clubs, or volunteering with our Summerfest celebration – this is an incredible opportunity for us to make a difference in our community as we declare that Jesus means more to us than anything else in the world.

How Can I Help as Part of SWBC?

Since Great Adventure is our church-wide initiative to reach the greater South Austin area, [we need the rest of the church](#) to come behind our teenagers to help make this possible. Our High School and Middle School students are working hard preparing to be the teams that share the gospel and stories of Jesus with kids throughout host-home neighborhoods. As the adults of SWBC, we want to support them in the roles necessary to make this possible. Below are the opportunities for how we can partner with our teenagers in reaching our city:

1. Host Home / Host Site Volunteers *(10 Needed)*

Role Purpose

Provides a welcoming, safe, and accessible environment for hosting a Backyard Bible Club. Helps identify and invite children and families within the neighborhood.

Responsibilities

- Open home/location for scheduled club times
- Help gather neighborhood children
- Provide basic hospitality (space readiness, optional refreshments)
- Communicate any needs or issues
- Distribute invitations
- Build relational bridges with neighbors
- Encourage attendance throughout the week

Expectations

- Friendly, flexible, and communicative
 - Supports club leadership without needing to lead programming
 - Represents the church well to neighbors
 - Outgoing and relationally driven
 - Comfortable initiating conversations

2. Driver (15 Needed)

Role Purpose

Safely transports student teams to and from host sites. Intentional about navigation, communication, and student debriefing and discipleship during transport.

Responsibilities

- Transport assigned team on schedule
- Follow provided maps and routes
- Communicate any delays or issues
- Ensure safety protocols are followed
- Help manage student behavior in vehicle and be intentional about student discipleship

Expectations

- Reliable, punctual, and safety-focused
 - Clear communicator with coordinator

3. Booth Co-Leaders (25 Needed)

Role Purpose

Leads a specific activity or food booth during SummerFest. Assists in running booth activities or food service.

Responsibilities

- Set up and operate assigned booth
- Lead and direct booth volunteers
- Ensure safety, efficiency, and fun experience
- Execute assigned tasks (serving food, running games, etc.)
- Engage guests warmly
- Maintain cleanliness and order

Expectations

- Organized and proactive
 - Able to lead small team under pressure

4. SummerFest Float Team *(15 Needed)*

Role Purpose

Provides flexible, real-time support across all areas of SummerFest to ensure smooth execution, problem-solving, and full coverage of the event.

Responsibilities

- Fill in for volunteer no-shows across any area (booths, food, registration, parking, etc.)
- Assist coordinators and team leads with immediate needs or last-minute adjustments
- Provide relief for volunteers needing breaks
- Help troubleshoot minor issues (supply shortages, guest needs, transitions)
- Support crowd flow and guest experience where needed
- Deliver or transport supplies between areas
- Assist with quick setup or teardown adjustments during the event

Expectations

- Highly flexible and willing to serve wherever needed
- Quick to respond and take initiative without needing constant direction
- Positive, calm, and solution-oriented under pressure
- Strong communicator with coordinators and team leads
- Physically able to move around the event space for extended periods

Deployment Areas

- Activity & Food Booths
 - Registration / Greeting / Parking
 - Entertainment / Stage support
 - Facilities / Setup / Cleanup
 - Prayer or response areas (if needed)
