Redeemer Hosts Good Friday Tre-Ore service

You are invited to attend part or all of the Tre-Ore (three hour) Service held at Redeemer Lutheran Church April 3 with Pastors from the surrounding churches participating. The service reflects on the final seven words Christ spoke from the cross during the three hours Christ hung on the cross.


The Tre-Ore will consist of seven twenty-minute segments, each segment will focus on one of the seven last words of Christ from the Cross, with a five-minute interlude between segments.

What an extraordinary occasion to gather on Good Friday afternoon to meditate on the crucifixion of our Lord, who vicariously took our sins upon Himself, suffered the punishment we deserved so that we could have forgiveness of sins and eternal life. 
