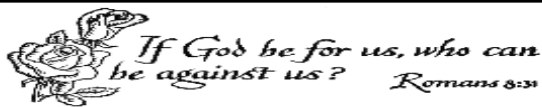

Faithful Parenting in Transition

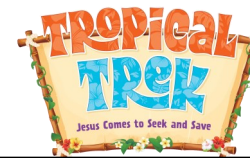
April 12th 2-4pm Immanuel Lutheran Church Fellowship Hall
