Patriotic Service July 5



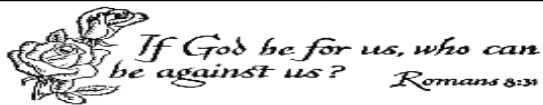
As the United States celebrates 250 years since its founding, it is fitting that we prepare to celebrate the blessings it has provide and the future God has in store. We are planning to
