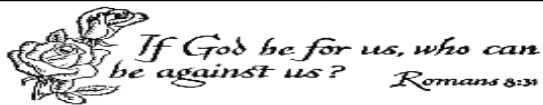
The blessing of religious freedom is not to be taken for granted. Let us gladly gather in worship even as we pray the Lord's guidance and blessing for our nation.
